



HOLY COMMUNION

We invite actively practicing Catholics who are properly disposed (in the State of Grace, having observed the Eucharistic fast) to come forward to receive Holy Communion. All others, including those of other faiths, are invited to approach with arms crossed over the chest to receive a blessing. At Holy Family, we receive Holy Communion under both species on the tongue. If you prefer to receive the Host alone on the hand, please have your hands clearly out before you approach.

ECCE AGNUS DEI

Celebrant: Behold the Lamb of God; behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

R. Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

COMMUNION CHANT

Tollite hostias, et introit in atria eius: ado- Bring up your sacrifices and come into His courts; adore the Lord in His holy temple.





HOMILY

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of Heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. Mikhail Ippolitov-Ivanov (1859 - 1935)


