CONSTRUCTION IMPACT ON CHURCH PARKING

During the week, please be aware that there are spaces in the parking lot behind church which are needed for construction equipment starting at 7am. For daily Mass, Eucharistic adoration, or other events, please park in the area closest to church, on the street, or in front of church.

Weekend parking will not normally be impacted. However, this weekend several spots will be occupied by a big pile of dirt! We would otherwise have to remove this dirt and then bring it back to fill in around the foundation walls once they are poured. It did not make sense to pay to move the dirt off-site and then pay again to bring it back several days later. This should last for approximately ten days. We anticipate that it will only impact parking for this weekend.

MISSIONARY APPEAL—AUGUST 5^{th} and 6^{th}

Fr. Jose Putenparambil, who is affiliated with the We Share Program supported by Holy Family Academy, will be at all the weekend Masses on August 5th and 6th for a mission appeal. He is from the Catholic diocese of Kerala, India. The Indian government does not provide any benefits for poor Christians so the diocese has to try to provide for their needs as they are able. India is about 80% Hindu and the Indian government prefers that all people are Hindu so this often results in persecution of Christians who only make up around 2.4% of the population.
