FAITH AND CULTURE: SUMMER READING SERIES

Dive into books that will stimulate your mind and enrich your faith this summer! On June 27th (Tuesday 7-8:30 pm) John Niemann will present "Morte d'Urban" by J. F. Powers in the Sts. Peter and Paul Room. This novel is an easy and humorous read about Father Urban Roche of the fictitious religious order the "Clementines." Despite his charm and skill, he is banished by his superior to a remote retreat house in rural Minnesota. Winner of the 1963 National Book Award, it is a modern classic. Often to as the greatest Catholic writer of the 20th century, Powers writes about priests in a way which perceptively demonstrates the tension between the weakness of the man and the exaltation of his calling.
