BEGINNING A SEASON THAT IS FAR FROM ORDINARY

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Our Christmas celebration has ended, and we have begun our worship of the fullness of Christ designated as "ordinary time." The Church uses the word "ordinary" differently from its common usage. The easiest way to understand it is by flipping the definitions, with "ordinary" having the elevated or special place and "extraordinary" being the less prestigious exception. For example, consider the sacrament of confirmation. The "ordinary" minister of this sacrament is the bishop, and he can delegate his authority to the priests of his diocese to become "extraordinary" ministers of the sacrament on his behalf. We can see then how Ordinary Time is far from ordinary in the common use of the term.

Consider this as we now worship the fullness of Christ from this season's very beginnings. Mark's gospel of last Monday, the first day of Ordinary Time, reveals the start of Jesus' public ministry after He was baptized. John the Baptist was arrested when we heard Jesus Himself proclaim a similar message as His cousin: "The Kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the Gospel." Then immediately, we heard how Jesus called Simon and Andrew, who were fishing. Jesus simply called to them and they "left their nets"; they dropped their means of livelihood, the most important things they owned, and followed Him. Notice there was no explanation given nor questions asked. Do we see how Jesus's most favored disciples did not need to be convinced by eloquent speech or a long friendship? They merely heard the voice of Jesus, and they left everything to follow Him. Their faith in God had somehow prepared them enough to be able to hear and understand that it was the Son of God who called them.

Our lesson here, as we begin the second week of Ordinary Time, is to see that the faith we have built during Advent and the Christmas season is now pushed to the next level. We have received the Son of God who is with us, and we have heard the Lord's call to mission. Now what shall we do? Let our prayer be like that of the first disciples: that we can stay "tuned in" to the voice of the Lord, that we can exercise enough faith to recognize His voice, and that we can place His mission first in our hearts over everything else. Then, we



will be prepared to "do whatever he tells you," just as Mary guided the servers at the wedding feast in Cana, where Jesus performed his first miracle. Consider what miracles Jesus desires to work through you!
