





CELEBRATING CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK & SAINTLY EDUCATORS

The Catholic Church possesses a rich legacy in the area of education, with countless holy men and women throughout the history of the Church dedicating their lives to enriching the minds and souls of youth through vibrant and faithful teaching. Catholic Schools Week (Jan. 26-Feb. 1, 2025) is an invitation not only to celebrate the tremendous gift of Catholic education in our community, but also to celebrate some of the great saints who serve as models for the Catholic education system today. This year, Catholic Schools Week coincides with the feast days of three exemplary Catholic educators: St. John Bosco (Jan. 31st), St. Thomas Aquinas (Jan. 28th), and St. Angela Merici (Jan. 27th). Each of these holy individuals has much to contribute to our understanding of faithful Catholic education.

St. John Bosco was born in 1815 in Turin, Italy. Shortly after being ordained to the priesthood, John Bosco began to work with poor young boys from the area, providing them with the education that he had not received in his youth. In addition, the first shelter he founded served as a space for recreation and, crucially, spiritual formation for the boys. Bosco had a special reputation for being an excellent preacher and using magic tricks to capture the attention of his young audience. He also placed high importance on helping his boys obtain apprenticeships and grow up to find successful work in society. John went on to found the Salesians, an order of priests and nuns dedicated to continuing the work John Bosco began among children in need. The saint is quoted as saying, "Without confidence and love, there can be no true education" (salesiansisterswest.org).

St. Thomas Aquinas, a 13th century Italian Dominican priest and a Doctor of the Church, serves as another exemplary model of a Catholic educator. Thomas showed a thirst for knowledge from a young age, leading him to become well-versed in grammar, logic, rhetoric, music, mathematics, and astronomy. Aquinas went on to be a professor in Paris and to direct Dominican schools in other parts of Europe. However, Aquinas is perhaps most famous for his eloquent and detailed writings defending the truths of the Catholic Faith. These writings, especially his *Summa Theologiae*, continue to be used after centuries to teach Catholic doctrine.

Finally, St. Angela Merici, born 1474 in Italy, is distinguished as the founder of the first uncloistered community of consecrated women, today known as the Ursuline Sisters. Angela imbued this religious order with her passion for the teaching and formation of girls, a mission she received after witnessing the lack of education available for young women in her local community. Angela went on to found schools and orphanages which saw great success and which now span thirty-seven countries. St. Angela, like St. John Bosco, urged her sisters to prioritize kindness, love, and faithfulness to God's calling in their mission of education.


