# **EPIPHANY PROCLAMATION 2025**

Know, dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ,

so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior.

On the fifth of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the twentieth day of April, you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the twenty-ninth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ, transferred to Sunday, the first day of June.

On the eighth of June, the feast of Pentecost.

On the twenty-second day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the thirtieth day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

# GOLD & SILVER COLLECTION

"Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh." –Matthew 2:11

Although few of us have precious oils and perfumes to offer Our Lord, many of us own gold and silver that is broken or no longer wearable. In addition to jewelry, other items of value include coins and even gold fillings. Solid sterling silver items may also be donated. These pieces can be given a new life in service of the church through a gold and silver collection.

Beginning today, the Feast of the Epiphany, you are invited to bring old gold and silver pieces that you are no longer in need of to the parish office during regular hours. Once collected, these precious metal items will be melted down and used to refurbish some of Holy Family's sacred vessels. Our immediate goal is to re-plate the parish chalice pictured below. After many decades, the gold plating has been almost completely worn away.

If you are uncertain about whether a piece is solid gold or silver, place



an ordinary magnet next to it. If the magnet has no effect on it, the item is made of a pure precious metal and can be donated to this collection! As it turns out, it doesn't take a wise man to discern whether something is true gold or silver!

# **EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING**

Blessed Chalk and Holy Water bottles located by all church exits.

All gather at the front door of the home.

(While making the Sign of the Cross)
All: In the name of the Father,
and of the Son, and of the Holy
Spirit. Amen.

**Leader:** Let us pray: Christus Mansionem Benedicat (In Latin, this means "May Christ Bless this home, Amen.) With chalk we sign this doorway, along with four crosses of the seasons and the numerals of the new year. (Leader marks doorway: [20 + C + M + B + 25])

Leader/Reader: A reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Galatians: "So then, while there is time, let us do good for all people, especially those who are of the household of faith." The Word of the Lord.

Each room is sprinkled with holy water.

(Living room) Leader: Bring us to live with you one day in heaven.
All: Bless this room, O Lord.
Amen.

(*Kitchen*) **Leader:** You prepare for us a heavenly banquet.

All: Bless this room, O Lord. Amen.

(Bedrooms) Leader: In you alone we rest peacefully.

All: Bless this room, O Lord. Amen.

(Bathroom) Leader: Cleanse us from all uncleanliness.

All: Bless this room, O Lord. Amen.

All return to the front door to pray together the Lord's Prayer.

All are sprinkled with holy water.
