LAST CALL FOR FIRST SACRAMENTS REGISTRATION

For families seeking preparation for your 2nd grader's first Reconciliation and first Holy Communion, you will find the Holy Family requirements below. Whether your 2nd grade child attends HFA, Religious Education (on Wednesday evening) or is Home-Schooled, everyone must register their child for their first sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion. If you have not done so yet, please contact Linda Wandrei for registration at linda.wandrei@hfcmn.org.

There will be two mandatory family catechesis classes (one for each sacrament) taught by Fr. Moriarty. It is required for at least one parent to attend with the child. To allow for more maturity, First Reconciliation will be pushed closer to Lent.

The mandatory Family Catechesis Class for Reconciliation will be Wednesday. February 11, 6:30-7:45pm in Fr. Moorman Hall. The mandatory Family Catechesis Class for Holy Communion will be Saturday, May 2, 8:45-11:30am in Fr. Moorman Hall. One parent is required to be with their child for the first 45 minutes of the lesson. The First Holy Communion Mass will be Saturday, May 9, 10:00am. We look forward to working with families as we prepare the children to meet Jesus in these first Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion.

The Belloc book club this past September, which focused on "How the Reformation Happened" was a great success! As many as 22 people gathered for one of the 6:30 AM sessions while the afternoon sessions were all well attended with 30 or more people. If you missed this short book study, but wanted to participate, I encourage you to pick up this book in the near future and read it on your own. At some point, I hope to write a short synopsis of some of my favorite insights from Belloc.

Many opportunities for delving more deeply into great books or essays that touch upon faith and culture are coming!

At the end of this month, 7pm Thursday, October 30, Dale Ahlquist will speak on G.K. Chesterton's novel, "The Man Who Was Thursday." After a short presentation of about 30 minutes by Dale, attendees will discuss in small groups the meaning and import of this great work. Obtain a copy as soon as possible so you can read the book before October 30!

In November, **John Hartnett** will present three talks on **Saint Augustine's** "**De Trinitate**" (**On the Trinity**). All three presentations will be on Thursdays starting at **7 PM on November 6**, **13**, **20**. Reading St. Augustine's work is not required before attending the talks.

Mark your calendar for Thursday, December 4, when Dale Ahlquist will lead a discussion on G.K. Chesterton's essay, "A Piece of Chalk."

AUGUSTINE'S "DE TRINITATE" SERIES

This 3-part series will give an introduction to one of St. Augustine's greatest works; De Trinitate; a wonderful, challenging, and influential work by this great Doctor and Father of the Early Church. Our exploration of De Trinitate will naturally look into the history behind this great work and its' author, but will primarily seek to help each of us contemplate the mystery of Blessed Trinity in whose image each of us is made.

Attempting to read this masterpiece or to grasp the content of the Trinity is, in Augustine's words; "...picking my way through dark and difficult places." Yet, to better grasp what it means to be made in God's Image, calls upon us to venture into this greatest mystery as we seek to "see the face of God".

The schedule for this series is as follows:

Week One; Thursday November 6, 2025 —7:00-8:30 pm in Sts. Peter & Paul room

Introduction to St. Augustine and De Trinitate; a look at the the life and times of St. Augustine, his service to the Church, a sampling of the earliest parts of of this masterpiece, providing scriptural proofs

Week Two; Thursday November 13, 2025 —7:00-8:30 pm in Sts. Peter & Paul room

The Scriptural basis for the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity; a deeper dive into the biblical roots of the mystery of the Blessed Trinity and addressing some of the philosophical and heretical challenges that arise in this perilous, yet advantageous spiritual and intellectual journey.

Week Three; Thursday November 20, 2025 —7:00-8:30 pm in Sts. Peter & Paul room

The Psychological Analogy, the Mystery, and a Spiritual Exercise, through which Augustine takes us on a journey allowing us to get a glimpse of the Trinity in the human soul.

This series is meant to be an introduction to the Trinity. Reading of the text is not required but certainly encouraged, The Edmund Hill O.P. translation will be used in the presentations. Other translation are perfectly acceptable. A number of free translations are available online.
