





COMMUNION CHANT Gregorian, Mode IV Remember your word to your servant, O Lord, by which you have given me hope. This is my comfort when I am brought low.



THE FEAST OF THE GUARDIAN ANGELS

This Thursday, October 2, we celebrate the Feast of the Guardian Angels. Although this Feast is relatively new to the liturgical calendar - during the counter reformation (late 1500's) - Angels who guard and protect are referred to in both the Old and New Testaments:

"Thus says the LORD: See, I am sending an angel before you, to guard you on the way and bring you to the place I have prepared. Be attentive to him and heed his voice." (Exodus 23:20) An Angel is given to the chosen people to help them get to the promised land. The Angel will even speak to them and should be heeded.

Jesus, when admonishing the Apostles for discouraging children from approaching Him, says: "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father." (Matthew 18:10) If children of the chosen people have angels assigned to them, all the more will Christians be given Angels for protection.

The Church has never definitively defined a doctrine stating that every Christian is assigned a Guardian Angel, but early church fathers speak about this reality. St. Jerome writes: "how great the dignity of the soul, since each one has from his birth an angel commissioned to guard it."

I encourage all the faithful to recite the Guardian Angels prayer every day. Not to revere and depend on the help of a guardian Angel would be a waste of the talents of an Angel; moreover, it is a rejection of a gift from God to assist us in obeying His Will as quickly and completely as His Angels!

In closing, the collect for the Feast of the Guardian Angels beautifully and meaningfully captures how Angels are given to us by God for our eternal benefit: "O God, who in your unfathomable



providence are pleased to send your holy Angels to guard us, hear our supplication as we cry to you, that we may always be defended by their protection and rejoice eternally in their company."
