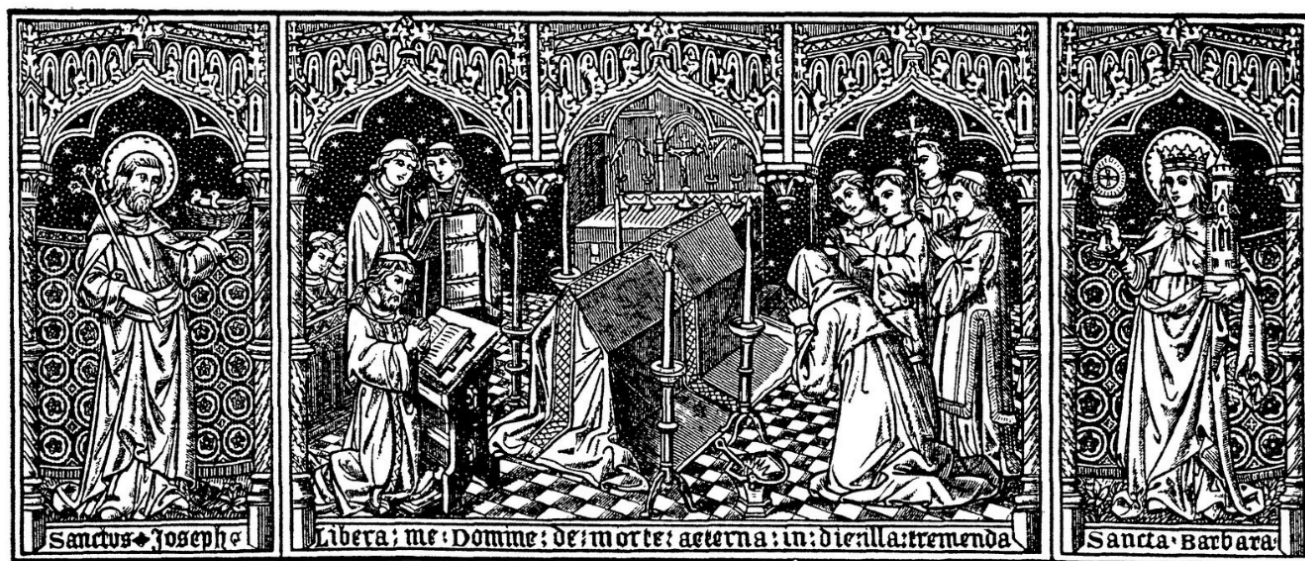

GOLDEN CHALICES & YUKON GOLD POTATOES

I am pleased to inform you that the two chalices and patens that were sent off to be refurbished have now returned looking new! With proper care, the re-gilded chalices will not need to be refinished for a few decades. This was paid for by the silver and gold collection taken up this past winter. Speaking of gold, I had a good fortune to harvest some Yukon gold potatoes before the end of the growing season. Most are in storage in the rectory cellar, but I have already eaten some of this miracle food. Outside of the rectory garage is a south facing patio, which provided plenty of sunlight. I learned that above-ground planters require more watering than a traditional inground garden. I also learned that not all store-bought potatoes are suitable for planting – the red potatoes I planted did not sprout because they must have been treated with some kind of chemical to prevent budding. My radishes went to seed before I could harvest, as I wasn't paying close enough attention. The cucumbers likewise needed more watering than I was able to provide. The sweet peppers turned out very well, although next year I hope to



plant the seeds indoors so that they can be harvested earlier. My sincere thanks to Debbie Tester, who minded the garden when I was out of town and gave me some very helpful advice.

AUGUSTINE'S "DE TRINITATE"

SERIES: THURSDAYS IN NOVEMBER

This 3-part series will give an introduction to one of St. Augustine's greatest works; De Trinitate. Our exploration of De Trinitate will look into the history behind this great work and its' author, but will primarily seek to help each of us contemplate the mystery of Blessed Trinity in whose image each of us is made.

The schedule for this series is as follows:

Week One; November 6, 7:00-8:30 pm in Sts. Peter & Paul room

Introduction to St. Augustine and De Trinitate; a look at the the life and times of St. Augustine, a sampling of the earliest parts of this text.

Week Two; November 13, 7:00-8:30 pm in Sts. Peter & Paul room

The Scriptural basis for the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity; addressing some of the philosophical and heretical challenges that arise.

Week Three; November 20, 7:00-8:30 pm in Sts. Peter & Paul room

The Psychological Analogy, the Mystery, a glimpse of the Trinity in the human soul.

This series is meant to be an introduction to the Trinity. Reading of the text is not required but certainly encouraged, The Edmund Hill O.P. translation will be used in the presentations. Other translation are perfectly acceptable. A number of free translations are available online.
