

PRAYING FOR THE DEAD AND OTHER PIOUS PRACTICES FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

Consider praying for repose of the souls of five different people.

- 1. A Deceased Relative
- 2. A Friend who has passed away
- 3. Someone you suspect has no one to pray for them.
- 4. A stranger you encountered who is likely deceased but who keeps coming to mind this might be an inspiration to intercede for a person.
- 5. An enemy or someone who has harmed you intentionally or unintentionally.

THROUGHOUT THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER CONSIDER OTHER PIOUS PRACTICES:

- Attend Mass more frequently as you offer prayers for your beloved dead.
- Perform simple sacrifices or acts of penance as reparation for the sins of the dead.
- Earn a plenary or partial indulgence for your beloved dead.
- Visit and pray at a few cemeteries.
- Learn the traditional verses and responses for the deceased: "Eternal rest grant unto him/her/them, O Lord.
 - And let perpetual light shine upon him/her/them.

May he/she/they rest in peace.

May his/her/their soul(s) and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.


LOST & FOUND


