Our Spring Gala, *Carnival in Venice*, will help raise funds to support Holy Family Catholic Church. This year, the total fundraising goal of the Gala is \$80,000: \$60,000 for parish operations and \$20,000 for a Fund-a-Need. Our Fund-a-Need goes toward a technology upgrade at both Holy Family Church and Holy Family Academy. The majority of the desktop computers in use at Holy Family were purchased in 2013. Over the years, our I.T. guru has lovingly cared for and upgraded these technological "dinosaurs" to lengthen their lifespans. However, the time has come for their permanent extinction! Holy Family is also currently using outdated servers and the 2016 version of Microsoft Office.

Our Spring Gala's Fund-a-Need will be used to purchase 40 recently refurbished desktop computers with more compact and efficient hardware. This money will also fund the most recent version of Microsoft Office, which offers more sophisticated collaboration tools, as well as three new servers which will enhance the performance and security of our systems. We anticipate completing this technology update before August 1st, 2025, allowing for a smooth transition into the upcoming school year.

Please plan on attending our March 1st Spring Gala, or contributing even if you cannot be with us in person. More information about making your contribution will be shared soon.

In closing, I'd like to reference Pope St. John Paul II's apostolic letter "The Rapid Development," in which he says of technology, "God has placed [it] at our disposal to discover, to use and to make known the truth, also the truth about our dignity and about our destiny as his children, heirs of his eternal Kingdom" (para. 14). With your generosity, we are able to obtain the tools needed to continue serving the people of God at Holy Family.

Thank you for your support of Holy Family Catholic Church and Holy Family Academy. May God reward you for your generosity!

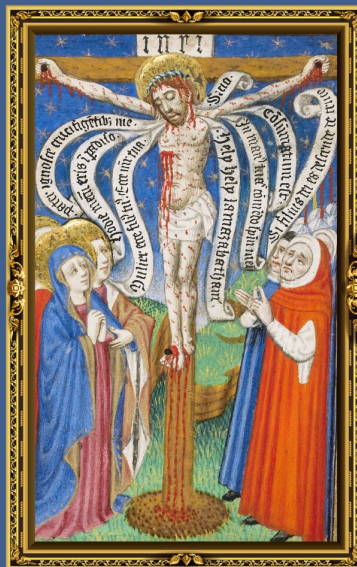
