Priest Conference

Every priest in the archdiocese has an opportunity for continued professional education on a modest budget, so in early January I attended the Saint Paul Center's West Coast priest conference. Twelve other archdiocesan priests were also in attendance! While Minnesota suffered from below zero temperatures, conference attendees enjoyed the sixty-to-seventy-degree weather in southern California. The main draw, however, was speakers such as Scott Hahn and John Bergsma, who are converts to Catholicism and superb scripture scholars. The theme for this year's priest conference was Jubilee. I learned many things about God's Old Testament plan for the Chosen People in regards to Jubilee celebrations. These are not mere anniversaries but are opportunities for the people to deepen their connections with God and family by starting afresh; for example, ancestral lands would be returned to their original owner during Jubilee years. The conference speakers reminded the priests in attendance that the continued spiritual meaning for Christians is we all need to have an opportunity to start over. We want every Sunday to be a chance to begin again with God and with those whom He has put into our lives! A day without work allows us to work on our relationship with God and family and allows God an opportunity to work on the healing of our hearts.

My professional expenses are paid for by the generous parishioners of Holy Family Catholic Church, and for this I am very grateful. I also thank the Napa Institute (run by Tim Bush, a faithful and generous Catholic), which sponsored the priest's conference and covered two thirds of the cost.

Reading Vacation

Thanks to the salary that you provide for me, I was also able to take a reading vacation in January. As I have aged, I have found great enjoyment in taking extended periods of time to read about my favorite subjects: history, culture, theology, philosophy, and Catholic literature.

Similar to the conference, I was able to get away to a warm place while serving as a "resort chaplain." It is a tough job, but somebody has to do it! I celebrated Mass every day in a meeting room transformed into a chapel (see picture below) at the Ko'a Kea resort on the Island of Kauai. In exchange for this priestly service, I received a room free of charge and a discount at a restaurant. This resort is run by a company founded by the same Tim Bush mentioned above. For several years he has been inviting priests to serve as resort chaplains at some of his properties. I even had the good fortune of running into him while he and other corporate officers were conducting a site visit. Besides celebrating Mass, taking extensive daily walks and enjoying fresh seafood meals, I read about the history of the 1777 Battle of Saratoga as well as a book exploring the "Mysteries of the Middle Ages."

This vacation allowed me to experience an extended Jubilee time of rest and



renewal. I hope and pray all of our Holy Family parishioners can also take the time for personal and family renewal so they can return to their daily lives refreshed and ready to live out their vocations with new spirit and vigor this Jubilee year.

ADORO TE ADORATION HOUR & POTLUCK | MARCH 8, 6-8PM

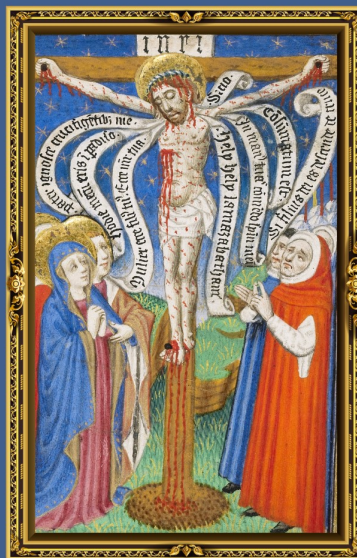
