FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION: CANDLEMAS

We have the rare treat of celebrating the Presentation of the Lord on a Sunday this year, also called Candlemas!

Every first born male was to be dedicated to God in honor of the Hebrew first born sons who were spared at Passover (Exodus 13:2). Mary and Joseph observed this tenet of the Law by presenting Jesus in the Temple forty days after his birth. At the same time, Mary would have gone through the purification rite after having given birth. St. Thomas Aquinas offers a beautiful reflection on the spiritual meaning of this event: "For our sake He was presented to the Lord that we may learn to offer ourselves to God." We must present our plans, hopes, dreams and our very lives to God. He has given us life and the gifts of reason and free will. Let us present to him these gifts so he may bless our actions and lives, and most importantly, direct us and everything we do in accordance with His will and for His glory.

At the Temple, the prophet Simeon sees our Lord and rejoices because he is granted the grace of looking upon the Messiah. It had been promised to him by God that he would not die until he saw the savior of the world. At this august meeting, we hear Simeon's words, the "Nunc Dimittis": "Lord, now you let your servant go in peace; your word has been fulfilled: my own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people, Israel" (Luke 2:29-32). Having beheld, and likely held, the baby Jesus, Simeon is now ready to depart this world. The Nunc Dimittis is said every night by all priests, deacons, consecrated, religious and many laity. Having spent the day in service of the Lord, each one of us must be ready and willing to depart from this world to be with God for eternity. I recommend families say this prayer at least once a week because it beautifully reminds us of openness to God's will and the fact that our service on earth will someday come to an end.

Simeon's reference to light reminds us that Jesus' presence enlightens



our minds and shows us the truth, hence, the connection with a candle-lit procession, the blessing of candles and the English name: Candlemas.

At the 5pm and 9am Masses this weekend, we will have a candlelit procession within the church and a blessing of candles for homes and for the upcoming feast of St. Blaise.
