



ON FASTING & FEASTING

CHURCH LAWS ON DAYS OF ABSTINENCE AND FAST

Days of Fast apply to everyone aged 18 to 59, inclusive, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. One full meal is permitted and two other meals may be eaten which, when combined, are less than a full meal. There is no eating between meals.

Although children are not required to fast, parents should consider helping their children to learn self-denial by not snacking between meals on these days or allowing a fourth small meal at an appropriate time.

Days of Abstinence begin on one's 14th birthday and apply to Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent. These laws oblige that you eat no flesh meat on these days. Those thirteen and younger may consume flesh meat, but parents might consider helping their young to practice a penance by also abstaining from meat with the rest of the family.

Days of Penance apply to all the Faithful during Lent and all the Fridays outside of Lent, with the exception of the Solemnities listed below. The Laws of Abstinence and Penance are both lifted after the recitation of Evening Prayer on the Eve of a Solemnity, which generally occurs after 4pm that day.

Solemnities During Lent:

March 19—Solemnity of St. Joseph

March 25—Solemnity of the Annunciation

PUTTING THE "FAT" IN "FAT TUESDAY" AND THE "FEAST" IN SOLEMNITIES

All are invited to special donuts and coffee this Tuesday for Mardi Gras! Please let your friends and family know that instead of Wednesday donuts, we will say "goodbye" to luxurious desserts on Tuesday, March 4th. Please join us downstairs after the 8am Mass!

We will also be having hospitality with donuts on Wednesday, March 19th (The Solemnity of St. Joseph) and Tuesday, March 25th (The Solemnity of the Annunciation). These solemn feasts, along with the continued tradition of Sunday donuts throughout Lent, will truly allow us to embrace Christ's words in the Gospel of Mark: "Can the wedding guests fast when the bridegroom is with them?"

In keeping with the penitential nature of Lent, there will be Wednesday hospitality with coffee but no donuts from March 5th-April 16th this year, with the exception of the two dates listed above. I recognize that this is a change from what is normally done at Holy Family, so allow me to explain why such a change is fitting.

Although not everyone fasts from sweets during Lent, we are called both individually and as a parish to imitate the example of Christ in the desert, who renounced earthly comforts in order to draw near to his Father. The slight discomfort of foregoing bodily pleasures transforms our souls and sweetens both the celebration of Easter and the "little Easters" of each Sunday (of course, we will still have donuts every Sunday during Lent).

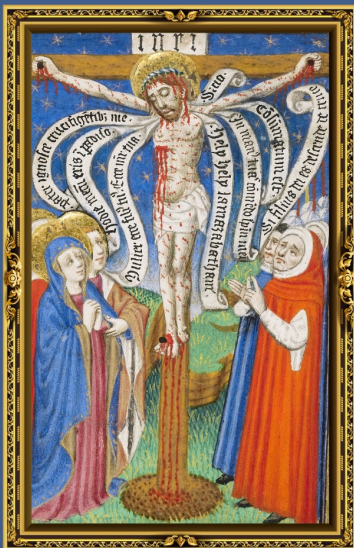
This Wednesday, March 5th, is Ash Wednesday. Masses will be at 7am, 8am, and 7pm.

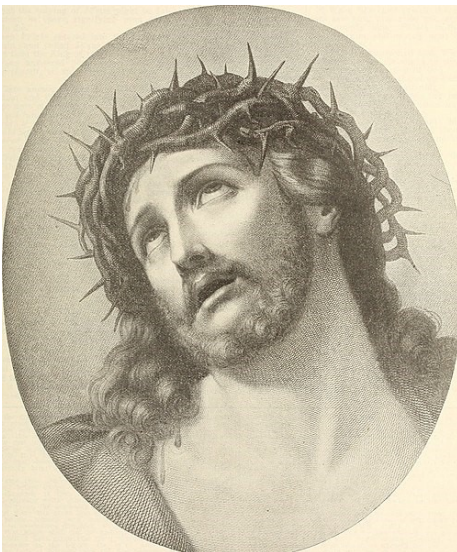
