





LAETARE SUNDAY

The fourth Sunday in Lent is called Laetare Sunday. The name for this Sunday comes from the first words of the introit: "Rejoice O Jerusalem, and all who love her." We are called to rejoice because now we have reached the halfway point of Lent. Our penances will come to an end soon as we celebrate the death and resurrection of Christ. The Catholic Encyclopedia reminds us, "special signs of joy [are] permitted on this day, intended to encourage the faithful in their course through the season of penance." Flowers may decorate the main altar, the priest wears rose vestments, and the organ may be played at Mass in a manner that is more than simply supporting congregational singing.

As we come to the midpoint of Lent, persevere in your additional prayers, works of mercy and penitential practices!

MARIAN CONSECRATION BY YOUNG LADIES AT HEA

Having completed a 33 day period of preparation, seven young ladies from Holy Family Academy made their Marian consecrations on the very appropriate Solemnity of the Annunciation. Consecration is an act by which "a person or thing is dedicated to the service and worship of God" (Catholic Encyclopedia). In the case of Marian consecration, the person is dedicated to Jesus through Mary. The individual places himself or herself in the protection of Mary in a special way, dedicates all of their thoughts, words, and actions to her (and through her to Christ), and receives the grace needed to imitate her holiness in a special way. The scriptural roots of Marian consecration come from the Gospel of John, where Jesus entrusts his beloved disciple to Mary from the cross.

In 1712, St. Louis de Montfort wrote "True Devotion to Mary," a work calling for all Catholics to fully consecrate themselves to Our Lady. In the 20th Century, Pope St. John Paul II was so inspired by de Montfort's writing that he adopted the phrase, "Totus Tuus Maria" on his papal coat of arms. Our young ladies used a program of preparation that utilized both the writings of St. Louis de Montfort and Pope St. John Paul the Great.

Please join me in offering a prayer of thanksgiving and



encouragement for those who have made their consecration.
