## "WHAT'S IN A NAME?" THE HOLY FATHER'S CHOICE OF LEO

In his first formal address to the College of Cardinals on Saturday, May 10th, Pope Leo XIV said: "I decided to take the name Leo XIV. There were many reasons, but mainly because Pope Leo XIII in his historic encyclical *Rerum Novarum* addressed the social question in the context of the first great industrial revolution. In our own day, the Church offers to everyone the treasury of her social teaching in response to another industrial revolution and to developments in the field of artificial intelligence that pose new challenges for the defense of human dignity, justice and labor." Leo the XIII identified how socialism was harmfully pitting class against class, unjustly attacking the right to own property, diminishing the role of the family, erroneously emphasizing the temporal in place of the eternal, and dismissing the centrality of Christ and his Redemption. These errors of socialism are still with us; the new pope would do well to address these mistakes with fresh fervor and clarity.

I am hoping one of the "many reasons" that went unstated is an allusion to Pope Leo XIII's Encyclical *A eterni Patris*, which advocated a return to Christian Philosophy grounded on Socrates, Aristotle and Thomas Aquinas. The modern world has for too long considered philosophy a "soft" science which doesn't lend itself to certainty. Nothing could be further from the truth! Philosophy gives us certainty about the nature of humanity, especially our faculties of abstract thinking and free will. Philosophy also offers us the tools of logic and analysis to discover truth about the universe and its creator, God!

The first pope to bear this name is now remembered as Pope St. Leo the Great, who reigned as Bishop of Rome from A.D. 440 to 461. Leo is famous for treating with Attila the Hun to stop his invasion of Italy. According to Catholic Encyclopedia: "Leo's [the Great] chief aim was to sustain the unity of the Church. Not long after his elevation to the Chair of Peter, he saw himself compelled to combat energetically the heresies which seriously threatened church unity." This reflects the motto of our new pope: "In Illo Uno Unum" (In The One, One or In



the One [we are] One). The primary doctrinal clarification during Leo the Great's papacy occurred at the Council of Chalcedon and was concerning Christ being of two natures, human and divine, united in one person. Belief in Christ's divinity has been greatly reduced—this could be another reason for the choice of the name Leo.

In Latin, Leo means "lion". May our new pope be as courageous as a lion in defending the truths of Christ and His Church.


