PRAY FOR THE CARDINALS WHO WILL ELECT THE NEXT POPE!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Please join me in praying that the Holy Spirit enlightens the Cardinals of the upcoming conclave. There is much speculation—too much speculation, in fact—about who will be the next pope. What is more important is that whoever is elected will cooperate with God's grace to bring about greater **unity** for the Church **in truth and love**.

Jesus said to Peter, "when you have returned, **strengthen** the brothers" (Luke 22:32, NAB). This is an essential element to the papacy: the strengthening of the brothers. This refers primarily to the apostles, and hence the successors of the apostles, the bishops. Popes should encourage bishops to teach the saving truth of Christ and not merely to be administrators. In addition, the pope should make the Vatican bureaucracy run more smoothly so bishops can have their questions and concerns addressed efficiently.

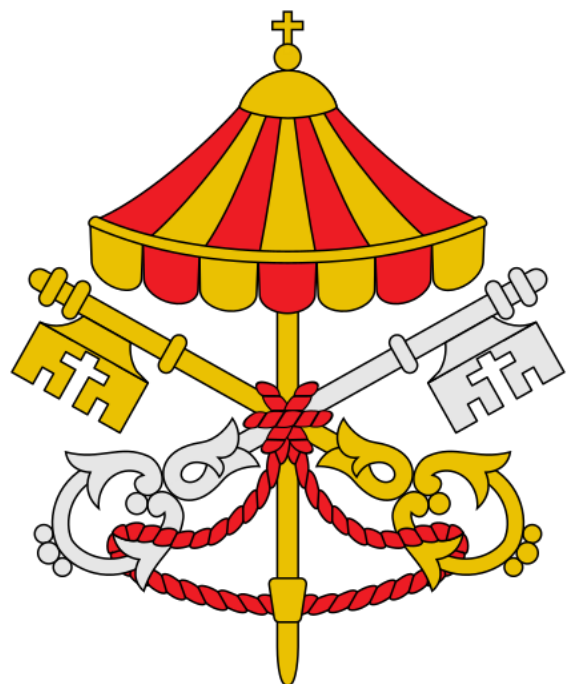
Jesus also prayed for the Apostles, "that they may be **one**" (John 17:11, NAB). The papacy is meant to be a source of unity. With the advent of modern mass communication, a cacophony of voices can be heard giving an almost infinite number of different opinions. The papacy affords us the rare opportunity to have one voice to speak on behalf of Christ in His Church, a voice that is easily recognizable, a voice of authority. At the Council of Jerusalem, Peter stood up after there was no small debate and clarified the question of whether or not Gentiles needed to convert to Judaism as part of converting to Christianity. The answer was no; this doctrinal decision was not decided by a committee or a vote, it was the voice of Peter, inspired and strengthened by the Holy Spirit. (Acts 15:7).

Popes, when speaking in union with the bishops as part of the ordinary magisterium of the church or in an extraordinary fashion such as an "Ex Cathedra" pronouncement, are protected from teaching error. Thank God! However, popes can be tempted to sin personally and make mistakes in administrative decisions. They can also fail in their teaching office by being

silent when the truth needs to be taught, or they can fail by being **confusing** when clarity is required.

In these trying times when even basic assumptions about family, marriage, sexual identity, and the value of human life from conception and natural death are all being questioned, and even attacked, we need the saving truth of Christ taught **clearly, convincingly, charitably** and **courageously!**
