



A BLESSED FIRST YEAR AT HOLY FAMILY

With my first year anniversary of being Pastor of Holy Family Catholic Church approaching, I would like to thank the wonderful people of this parish for their prayers and support! Your desire to know, love and serve God is truly remarkable and very edifying for all those who witness it. It is truly a gift to serve as your pastor.

Many of the blessings I have experienced in the past year are a result of the work performed by my predecessors and I would be remiss if I did not recognize these men and their accomplishments, from which we all have benefitted.

Fr. Joseph Johnson, who served 12 years, deserves recognition and thanks for the ways in which he increased discipleship and hospitality. Crusader Hall will continue to benefit the parish and school for many decades by providing a space for athletics, socializing, and continuing education. The new Nazareth House is a stroke of genius because it adds an hospitable and domestic element to apostolic activities. What better kind of a building to conduct formation and communion than a home named after the city where the Holy Family lived? Fr. Johnson is also particularly gifted in his sense for and knowledge of Sacred Art. This is displayed by his very tasteful and appropriate additions to the church sanctuary, for example, the ornate wood communion rail and the carved scripture verses above the confessionals. He found lovely art — such as the Our Lady of Walsingham shrine — to aid in devotion. The art Fr. Johnson has chosen for the school and Crusader Hall is similarly beautiful and meaningful.

Fr. Thomas Dufner became Pastor in 1995 and served for 17 years. He is an excellent example of what can be realized when a parish has a strong and active spiritual father for a lengthy time. Fr. Dufner did an outstanding job of bringing the saving truth of Christ to the people of God. As Jesus said, "If you remain in my word, you will truly be my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31-32). Fr. Dufner has been a mentor to me and exemplifies what it means for a spiritual shepherd to feed his flock with the teachings of Christ. He greatly supported homeschool parents and this tradition has continued. He led efforts to remodel and re-open the parish school, a feat that is quite rare for a pastor and parish to accomplish! Fr. Dufner is particularly gifted with long-term, strategic planning. As King David gathered resources and material so that his son, Solomon, could someday build the Temple; so did Fr. Dufner acquire property that enabled the later expansion of Church and School land on which Crusader Hall and the Nazareth House were constructed.

Again, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to the people of this parish. Being your pastor is a tremendous honor and a great responsibility. Please pray that I may serve with a shepherd's heart and always follow God's Holy Will, especially as it involves providing you the truth of Christ and His Church, as well as, beautiful worship.
