LEARN HISTORY WITH BELLOC & Fr. MORIARTY, THURSDAYS IN SEPTEMBER



This fall, I invite adult members of the parish to join me for a book club centered on Hilaire Belloc's "How the Reformation **Happened.**" Belloc was a distinguished British author, intellectual, historian, and politician from the early 20th Century whose Catholic Faith profoundly impacted his work. Belloc was a close friend of G.K. Chesterton, and his writing displays similar brilliance. "How the Reformation Happened" provides in-depth insight into the forces and events in Europe during the seventeenth century that led to the Protest reformation. All of this

in a book that is only a half-inch thick!

The Belloc Book Club will be made available in two sessions: one from 6:30-7:30am and one from 5-6pm. Both sessions will cover the same material and will take place in Fr. Moorman Hall on Sept. 4, 11, 18, and 25. Before each session, participants will be asked to read the assigned chapters (about 30-40 pages) in preparation for a short lecture I will deliver, followed by, robust group discussion. Discussion questions will be provided.






