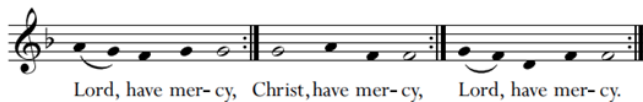

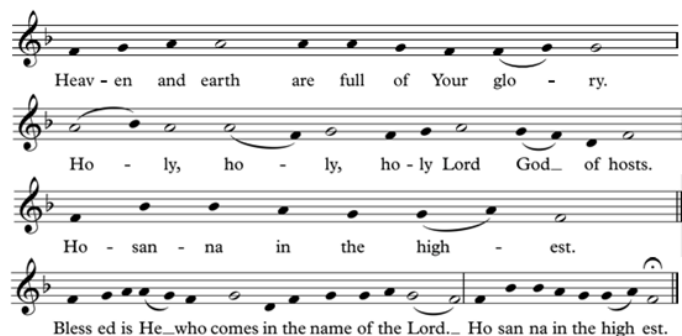

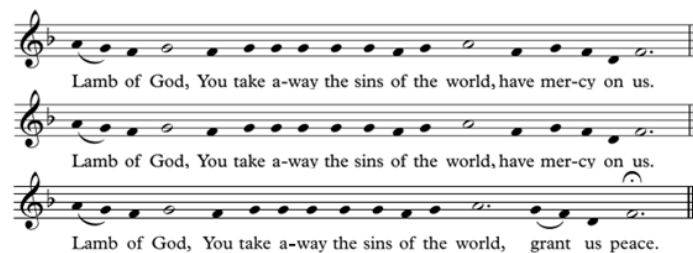

## IN GRATITUDE FOR THE WISDOM OF MY BROTHERS IN THE PRESBYTERATE: PART I

At the recent Biannual Presbyteral Assembly, I was invited to share with my fellow priests some brief reflections on my over 25 years in the ministry. It was an honor for me to focus on the gratitude I have for the wisdom my elder brothers in the presbyterate have imparted to me in word and action. A few of these men have left especially memorable impressions on my priesthood.

**Fr. Bernie Reiser**, who baptized me, had a tremendous work ethic and was generous to a fault. As a teenager, I secretly loved the fact that Fr. Bernie would drowse off in the confessional, only waking to give me a penance and absolution! When I would visit the adoration chapel late at night while I was on break during college, he would be pacing back and forth, finishing his Divine Office.

**Fr. Patrick Hipwell** - "Respect the knowledge, experience and expertise of your finance council and parish council members. A Masters' of Divinity doesn't qualify you to be an expert in everything!"

**Fr. Girard Steckler S.J.** was my college chaplain and first spiritual director. No matter what you brought him—good, bad, or ugly—he would exclaim, "Wonderful! Excellent!" and help you see how God could work with it.

**Fr. Steve Hoffman** introduced me to the great contemporary spiritual writer, Jacques Phillippe.

A seminary scripture professor, **Fr. John Echert**, impressed on me the fact that faith and reason could coexist with modern scripture studies: the historical critical method doesn't have to be hysterical or heretical!

**Fr. Michael Skluzacek**- "Parish and finance council members should always examine the pros and cons of every consideration."

The late dogmatic seminary professor, **Fr. Jerome Dittbemer**, understood the importance of continued scholarship. He taught us, "Do not stop reading after you are ordained or your homilies and your people will suffer."

**Fr. Rolf Tollefson** impressed on me that gratitude is where everything needs to begin.

The Late **Fr. Paul LaFontaine** stated, "At the end of the day, it's not about programs, focus groups, avoiding litigation or scandal but the salvation of souls."

While I was on retreat during my first week in the priesthood, **Fr. Peter Laird** generously invited me to hear confessions for the first time at St. Olaf. He told me beforehand, "receive their sins and give them to Jesus; place them at the foot of the cross."

**Fr. John Klockeman**, my weekend assistant at Mary Queen of Peace, preached a sermon that has stuck with me: "Let Christ challenge you!"

**Fr. John Bauer**, the elder, stated at one of my first presbyteral assemblies the aphorism: "be good, be brief, be gone." If I can't be the first, I can always be the second and third.

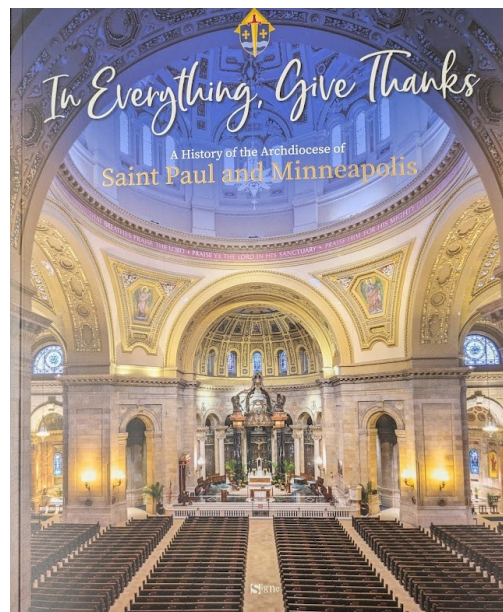

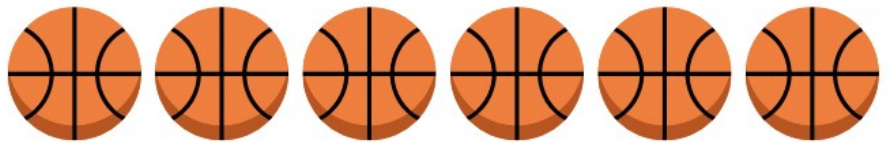

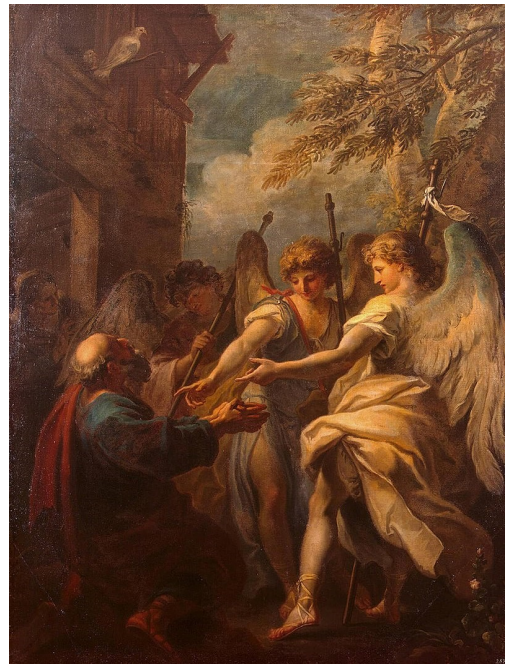
