





# IN GRATITUDE FOR THE WISDOM OF MY BROTHERS IN THE PRESBYTERATE: PART II

**Fr. Steve Ulrick** was my first pastor and taught me the very practical tip of having a thesis statement for homilies: "try to distill the homily down to one sentence."

**Fr. Michael Miller** while in seminary said, "Read the Vatican II documents—everyone is quoting this or that passage." So, in my third year of seminary I read all the conciliar and post conciliar documents.

When St. Agnes High School was going through monetary troubles, **Fr. John Ubel** let parents and alumni know what needed to happen financially. The people of God stepped up and donated over two million dollars. The difficulties we face as pastors are not just ours to handle by ourselves; the faithful must know they have a share in solving the problems in our parishes.

**Fr. Robert Altier** told me, "I don't always have to give advice when hearing Confessions. Christ can actually do something in the sacrament."

I had the honor of being the first associate to **Bishop John LeVoir**, a man who exemplified abandonment to Divine Providence.

Monsignor George Welzbacher, known and loved here at Holy Family, is a man of humility and brilliance with a great love of knowledge. I found him constantly reading and learned much from his insights into history, culture, literature, and theology. I was one of several priests who would watch movies with Monsignor Welzbacher. Despite his refinement he admitted, "Mark, I must admit I enjoy a little gratuitous violence from time to time, as I am wont."

The late **Fr. Frank Kittock** modeled teaching lay leadership and inviting parishioners into true stewardship.

**Fr. Thomas Dufner** exemplifies the ability to see the potential in parishes and to lovingly and positively put into practice what the Lord said: "The truth will set you free" (John 8:32).

Monsignor Richard Schuler helped me see that Church authority, canon law, and general instructions, etc., are about mutual rights and responsibilities. A member of the hierarchy once asked him, "Dick, when are you going to turn your altar around?" To which he responded, "When you can show me in a document from Rome where it says I must."

I heard that **Archbishop John Roach** would ask priests who were departing from the ministry, "When did you stop praying?" Prayer is indispensable for the survival of one's priestly vocation.

**Archbishop Harry Flynn** taught me that who you hire is important. He helped bring about great and needed improvements in our archdiocese and seminary.

Last but not least, **Archbishop Bernard Hebda** brought to life the *sensus fidei fidelium* during the 2022 synod and gave his flock inspired goals that in my opinion are the best things to have happened to our archdiocese.

I am privileged to serve the Church alongside these and many other faithful priests. Please always remember to pray for me and my brother priests in the archdiocese.
