A MORALITY FROM A GALAXY MUCH NEARER THAN YOU THINK

As a Stars Wars fan from my youth, I was disappointed with the prequels and sequels to the first three Star Wars films, but I kept hoping for a decent addition to the franchise. The reviews for "Rogue One" were very good, however, so I gave it a chance. In the very first scene, one of the protagonists, a rebel named Cassian Andor, shoots an Imperial informant (an innocent man who trusts him) to prevent him from falling back into the hands of the Empire. I do not mind heroes having faults, but cold-blooded murder is disappointing. Fortunately, the movie ended with a positive portrayal of honorable sacrifice for a worthy cause.

A prequel in the form of a series, the recent show "Andor" depicts Cassian's backstory, as well as, other characters of the nascent Rebellion against the Galactic Empire. A central resistance leader, Luthen, gives a much-acclaimed monologue that expresses a significant theme in the story: "What is my sacrifice? I'm condemned to use the tools of my enemy to defeat them. I burn my decency for someone else's future." The tools of the enemy use he does! Another character states, "My conclusion is simple. Weapons are tools. Those that use them are, by extension, functional assets that we must use to our best advantage. The Empire has no moral boundaries, why should we not take hold of every chance we can?" The series has been acclaimed for being gritty and it succeeds. The moral lesson being taught is clear: you can be evil for the sake of expediency in countering a greater evil. In other words: the ends justify the means.

Too often, we are all tempted to act in this way. We feel wronged by someone at work, so we justify an underhanded retaliation to get even. A relative makes accusations in front of others, so we do the same. Someone lies or exaggerates to embarrass us, so we fight fire with fire. A sibling causes family strife over inheritance money, we conclude they don't deserve our parents' money and we take every means not to distribute the money as was specified in the will.

Jesus told his disciples, "Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you" (Luke 10:19). Jesus wants us to fight evil but not in a harmful way. It is not simply a matter of our avoiding being harmed by the evil we fight, but also that we should not harm ourselves in the process! This means taking the proverbial high road when someone else takes the low road. Not exaggerating when an opponent exaggerates. Not lashing out in anger when someone angrily confronts us. Not bringing up past harms by the other even though he or she dredges up the past.

Behaving in a Christian manner is difficult and painful, but we avoid the greater pain of harming our own souls by becoming evil.

Pope St. Pius X wrote, "There is no true civilization without a moral civilization, and no true moral civilization without the true religion." Let us practice true religion by always fighting fair when fighting evil is required.
