THE FIRST AND LAST APOSTLES: STS. PETER & PAUL

The Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul has been celebrated since as early as 258 and commemorates the date on which both great Apostles were martyred in Rome. When June 29th is on a Sunday, the Solemnity takes precedence over a Sunday in Ordinary Time. I love it when this happens! Every six or so years, the entire church has an opportunity to celebrate these great apostles on a Sunday. It will next occur in 2031. This solemnity is especially notable this year, since it is the 175th anniversary of our Archdiocese, which is under the special patronage of St. Paul.

PETER CALLED FIRST

"As [Jesus] passed by the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting their nets into the sea; they were fishermen. Jesus said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' Then they abandoned their nets and followed him." (Mark 1:16-18).

Jesus called Peter from being a fisherman to be the leader of the Apostles. It was not all smooth sailing. Jesus once compared Peter's actions to those of the Devil with the words, "Get behind me, Satan" (Mark 8:33). Peter asked Jesus to depart because he [Peter] was a sinful man (Luke 5:8). Peter denied Christ three times (Matthew 26). Despite Peter's weaknesses, our Lord loved him and gave him great graces and responsibilities.

PAUL CALLED LAST

"Last of all...he appeared to me. For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. Indeed, I have toiled harder than all of them; not I, however, but the grace of God [that is] with me. Therefore, whether it be I or they, so we preach and so you believed" (I Corinthians 15:8-11).

Jesus revealed Himself to Paul about five years after His resurrection. Paul went from being a persecutor of the Church to its most effective preacher! Both St. Peter & St. Paul are wonderful examples of how God's "power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

Although the two saints had some serious disagreements (Galatians 2:11-14), they ultimately worked together for the salvation of souls and serve as a model for unity in the Church. Peter and Paul are frequently referenced together in ancient writing: St. Irenaeus writes, "the greatest and most ancient church, known by all, founded and organized at Rome by the two most glorious Apostles, Peter and Paul" (Against Heresies 3.3; cf. 3.1).

Both saints ultimately witnessed to Christ with their blood in Rome.

Sts. Peter and Paul, pray for us.


