## WEEKDAY SACRED MUSIC & FRIDAY DEVOTIONS

### PROGRESSIVE SOLEMNITY

There have been several different practices for weekday Masses over the past twenty years at Holy Family, especially in regards to how much sacred music accompanies Holy Mass. I would like to make some slight changes to how we celebrate Masses during the weekdays, as well as, our Friday devotions.

The phrase *progressive solemnity* means that we add more solemnity when we celebrate a feast or holy day. I realize that there is an old saying: "to sing is to pray twice," but that does not mean that we need to make every prayer into a song. Going forward we will make a greater distinction between feast days and weekdays that are not feasts; the latter are referred to in the Church as *feria* or *ferial days*. This will result in many weekday Masses, even during the school year, where we do not sing.

Wednesday HFA & HFHE Masses during the school year will always be accompanied by sacred music. We will add sacred music and more solemnity on feasts and solemnities throughout the liturgical year. For example, in September, we have two feasts: The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Monday, Sept. 8) and the Feast of Sts. Michael, Raphael, and Gabriel (Monday, Sept. 29). In addition to these feasts, all the Wednesdays in September will have music as usual.

### FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTIONS

Jesus revealed to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque His desire for First Friday devotions. I would like to place an emphasis on having a short time of public Adoration every First Friday. In order to expose our students in particular and the parish as a whole to more beautiful and varied devotions, I will be instituting the addition of the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and other special litanies that are appropriate to the particular month. However, there will not be Exposition and Benediction on the other Fridays of the month following the 8am Mass. We will continue the tradition of reciting the Divine Mercy Chaplet on First Fridays—we will no longer sing the Divine Mercy Chaplet. In my humble opinion, it is more common to recite the Chaplet and I would like to prepare our young people for the most common way the prayer is done (we will still sing the Chaplet publicly on Divine Mercy Sunday).

So, on the First Friday of September, we will expose the Blessed Sacrament and the clergy will lead the Divine Mercy Chaplet followed by the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and ending with Benediction. In October, a month in which we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary, we will recite the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary instead of the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In November, we will recite the Litany of the Saints. In March, because of the Feast of St. Joseph, we will recite the Litany of St. Joseph. In May, we will again recite the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary. During the intermittent months we will revert to the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

I look forward to marking the First Fridays of the liturgical year in this special way with each of you!

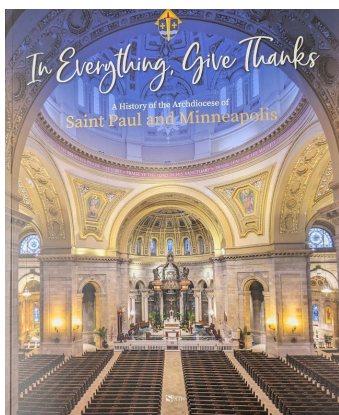
