FEAST OF THE TRANSFIGURATION



"Jesus took Peter, John, and James and went up a mountain to pray. While he was praying his face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white. And behold, two men were conversing with him, Moses and Elijah, who appeared in glory and spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem." -Luke 9:28-36

This Wednesday, August 6, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration. It was an important moment for these apostles because they were chosen to witness the Glory of our Lord! One could say Peter, James and John were given an opportunity to be strengthened ahead of the impending suffering and death of Jesus. Furthermore, Peter, who would eventually deny our Lord, could have this moment of encouragement to know that even his denial was not leading to Jesus denying His love and special revelation to him. John, who would be the only apostle at the foot of the cross, was undoubtedly fortified in his courage to stay close to Jesus because he knew of Jesus's ultimate victory. Jesus likely chose James because he would be the first apostle to be martyred and needed a bolster to his faith for his own future suffering.

Jesus knows each of our hearts and minds, He knows our fears and weaknesses. Jesus will make known to each of us His power, His Glory, His grace so that we too are transformed after His glory.
