MEET OUR NEW DIRECTOR OF SACRED MUSIC!

Dear Parishioners, School Families, and Music Lovers,

Glory to Jesus Christ now and forever! My name is Eli McMahon, and I am the new music director for Holy Family Catholic Church. A few fun facts about me before I dive into the Holy Family Sacred Music program:

I hail from a farm outside of Hartford, South Dakota. I have a beautiful wife of two years, Brooke, and seven-month-old daughter, Harriet. Immediately preceding Holy Family, I served as the Director of Sacred Music at Saint John the Baptist in Jordan, MN. While Sacred Music is my chief passion, I also enjoy reading, cooking, hiking, card games, and a good 1v1 basketball game.

It is an incredible joy to inherit a music program which is so steeped in the riches of the Church's tradition and is committed to glorifying the Lord through the highest of musical expressions. May the Lord continue to work at Holy Family, and form us through good, true, and beautiful sacred music in service of the liturgy.

To that end, I would like to list some of the myriad ways to get involved in the music program at Holy Family:

Youth Choir: open to youth ages 7-17. Rehearsals will begin September 10th and will run from 3:15-4pm on Wednesdays in the HFA Choir Room. This group and the Chamber Choir will sing for a weekend Mass about once a month.

Chamber Choir: an auditioned group for youth (boys and girls) aged 9-14. Auditions will take place following Youth Choir on September 10th, and rehearsals will take place from 4:15-5pm on Wednesdays in the HFA Choir Room.

Parish Choir: open to all aspiring singers from ages 12-102! Rehearsals will take place on Thursdays from 7-8:45pm, starting on September 4th. This group sings for 9am Masses and select feast days. Try it out for a month or a season to see if it is the right fit for you – you will find it a welcoming, fun-loving, and excellent group.

Schola Cantorum: a professional quartet, SATB, which sings for the 9am and 11am Masses. They support the Parish Choir at Thursday rehearsals as well.

Saint Cecilia Academy for Strings: a wonderful K-12 string program featuring private lessons and an ensemble, run by Mike and Liz Sobieski. These take place Wednesday afternoons at Holy Family Academy.




