Saint of the Week: The Venerable Bede

If you open an anthology of British literature, you are likely to find the writings of at least three Catholic saints, Juliana of Norwich, Thomas More, and this week's subject, the Venerable Bede. Born near the famous twin monastery of St. Peter and St. Paul at Wearmouth-Jarrow in Northumbria, England, Bede was cared for and educated by the monks of the monastery from the age of three. He joined the brothers, was ordained a priest, and spent his days and years studying Scripture, teaching, and writing. He wrote commentaries on the Bible, biographies, theological works, and scientific works, but his best-known work is the *Historia Ecclesiastica Gentis Anglorum* (Ecclesiastical History of the English People), written in Latin and completed in the year 731. Here Bede describes many events in English history including the occupation by the Romans and Angles, the Christianization of the island, the founding of the double monastery at Whitby by the great abbess, St. Hilda, and the charming story of the first known English poet, Caedmon. Caedmon was a brother at Whitby who was asked to sing a song. Ashamed because he did not know any songs, Caedmon went off to tend to the animals and late that night dreamed that a voice told him to sing about Creation. Caedmon's song, though written in Old English, was translated into Latin by Bede for his history.

Bede was given the title Venerable because of his wisdom and learning, a title that was formally bestowed on him at the Council of Aachen in 831. In 1899 he was declared the only English Doctor of the Church. We celebrate the feast of St. Bede, the patron saint of scholars and historians, on May 25.
