

## SAINT OF THE WEEK Saint Elizabeth of Portugal

She was given the name of her great-aunt, Saint Elizabeth of Hungary. Elizabeth of Portugal was born in 1271, the daughter of King Peter III of Aragon. When she was twelve she married King Denis of Portugal and spent much of her time helping the poor and founding convents, hospitals, and orphanages. She earned the title of Peacemaker because she worked diligently to bring peace to her household, especially when her son Alfonso led rebellions against his father. Elizabeth also helped to reconcile Ferdinand IV of Castile and his cousin Alfonso IV of Aragon and also mediated a dispute between Ferdinand and Elizabeth's brother James II of Aragon. She even had to endure exile when her husband believed she was partial to Alfonso. Elizabeth became a Third Order Franciscan (a lay person who follows the rules of the order) after her husband's death. Elizabeth died on July 4, 1336 and was canonized in 1626. Elizabeth is often depicted in art wearing royal attire and with a dove or an olive branch symbolizing her efforts to bring peace. We celebrate her feast on July 4. She is the patron saint of the Third Order of St. Francis.

## MISS BEHAVIOR RESEARCHES INDEPENDENCE DAY

Dear Miss Behavior:

What can you tell us about the history of Independence Day, also known as the Fourth of July?

Sincerely, *Jefferson Adams* 

Dear JA:

On July 2, 1776, while the American Revolution was being fought, the Second Continental Congress agreed to a resolution declaring independence proposed by Virginia's Richard Henry Lee. Then the Congress began working on a document that would explain what they were doing and why. Written for the most part by Thomas Jefferson, this document, the Declaration of Independence, is worth rereading for its stirring and inspiring words, such as the statement that we all have the right to "Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness." People living in the eighteenth century liked using capital letters for nouns, a custom that in this case dramatizes those important words. Note, by the way, that we are not guaranteed happiness, just the right to try to find it. The Founding Fathers were realists and knew that the government could not issue happiness certificates to its citizens. Note also that these rights, given to us by God, are "unalienable," that is, they cannot be taken away.

John Adams, one of those present, predicted in a letter to his wife Abigail that July 2, 1776 would be a great day for subsequent generations and urged that the day be celebrated "with pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations, from one end of this continent to the other, from this time forward forevermore." Adams was right about everything but the date. As it turned out, Americans decided to celebrate not July 2, the date the resolution was approved, but July 4, the date that appears on the document. Americans tend to believe that the Declaration of Independence was signed on July 4, but, dear reader, that is not quite accurate. Most of the delegates, it seems, signed the Declaration on August 2, though I am told that both Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, who were participants in this historical event, came to believe that the signing actually took place on July 4. This is quite confusing. Both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, signers of the Declaration and our second and third presidents, died on July 4, 1826. I think that's another reason to keep Independence Day where it is.
