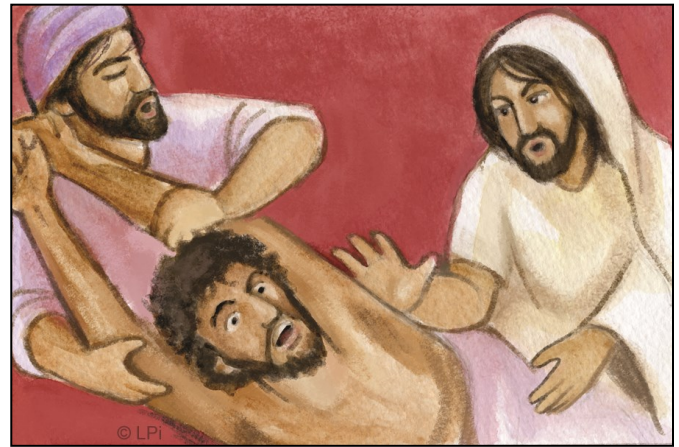

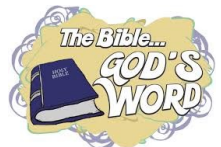

SAINT OF THE WEEK: SAINT ANSGAR

Born near Amiens (now part of France) to a noble family on September 8, 801, Ansgar was sent to Corbie Abbey after his mother's death. A vision the boy had at the abbey convinced him to take both his faith and his education more seriously. Christianity having been established in Saxony (today in northern Germany), missionaries were then setting their sights on the lands to the north. Ansgar joined a group of monks who took the faith to Jutland (now in Denmark). When the Swedish King Björn Hauge asked for Christian missionaries, Ansgar, his assistant Witmar, and others made many converts in Sweden and built the first Christian church. In 831 Ansgar became Archbishop of Hamburg.

The Viking culture, however, was still alive in the lands to the north, and Ansgar saw years of work disappear when Northmen destroyed Hamburg in 845 and took control of the Scandinavian regions. Ansgar returned to Denmark and Sweden in 854 to rebuild the Christianity that had been destroyed. His holiness, simplicity, and preaching were the keys to his great success at winning converts. Ansgar, it is said, healed many sick people. Rimbert, his student, successor, and biographer, wrote that "sick people came eagerly to him, not only from his own diocese, but from a great distance, demanding from him healing medicine. He, however, preferred that this should be kept quiet rather than that it should be noised abroad. For when these signs of power were spoken of on one occasion in his presence, he said to a friend, 'Were I worthy of such a favor from my God, I would ask that he would grant to me this one miracle, that by His grace He would make of me a good man.'"

Saint Ansgar, the Apostle to the North, died in 865. We celebrate his feast on February 3. He is the patron saint of the Scandinavian countries.

Catholic Charities Annual "Keep the Kids Warm" Campaign During Poverty Awareness Month

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Youngstown is calling upon Catholics and others of good will to support a special collection to provide winter utility assistance for families in need. The "Keep the Kids Warm" campaign will take place during January, the month designated by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as "Poverty Awareness Month."

Approximately 43% of the households in the Diocese of Youngstown have difficulty affording life's basic necessities. Poverty Awareness Month draws attention to those who live below the federal poverty level, as well as those who are working but are unable to keep up with the cost of living.

"Keep the Kids Warm" assists working poor families who do not qualify for government assistance; families waiting for PIPP (Percentage of Income Payment Plan) Plus to authorize assistance; and families whose HEAP (Home Energy Assistance Program) benefits have been exhausted. Catholic Charities serves people of all faiths and no faith as resources allow. Last year, Catholic Charities impacted 5,733 people through its utility assistance efforts across the Diocese of Youngstown.

FOLLOW JESUS AND FOLLOW THE LINES

Dear Parishioner (s)

We all enjoy our new parking lot by Saint Nicholas church and I have heard many compliments from many of you how our parking lot is well situated and accessible for people to get in and get out. However, some of our parishioners (maybe) have decided to make their own rules and regulations where to park their cars. This **BAD** habit **HAS TO STOP**.

I have people coming to me after the masses or they call the office to tell me, that the entrance to the parking lot from the FIFTH STREET entrance is too narrow, due to **ILLEGAL** parking. People are creating a new (**ILLEGAL**) parking lane while blocking other cars to enter or to leave the parking lot. There is no excuse for this selfish act. If their excuse is: "*I will leave the mass before people leave the church*", they are incorrect and they can even create more problems. What if a person, whose car is being **BLOCKED**, needs to leave because of an emergency and they cannot leave the parking lot? What if an emergency vehicle needs to access the parking lot and the entrance is too narrow, so they would have to drive around the block? Every second counts. Please, follow the parking lines and if someone wants the parking spots by the school, they need to come early otherwise they have to park somewhere else. To stop this behavior, I have come up with three solutions:

1. As you are well aware, we have installed the cameras around the parking lot and if this **ILLEGAL** action will not stop, some people can expect a "friendly" phone call from their pastor. (I would not recommend this step).
2. Another step we can take is to establish an AA meeting for people who are addicted to **SELFISH** and **ILLEGAL** parking and I will be sending personal invitations to those meetings.
3. The last, and the most practical step to resolve this issue would be to do this: As you come to church to learn how to follow Jesus, please, follow the yellow lines as well. God is watching you, as well as, Father Martin.

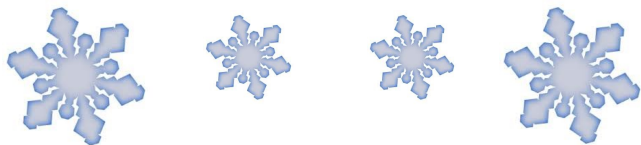

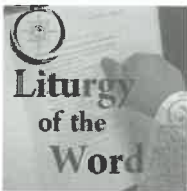

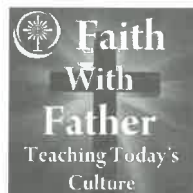
