SAINT OF THE WEEK: SAINT ANTHONY OF PADUA

Many people invoke Saint Anthony when looking for lost articles. Many churches contain a statue of Anthony, who is often depicted holding the Christ Child. Who is this beloved saint?

Born in Lisbon, Portugal in 1195 and the son of a knight in King Alfonso II's court, Anthony came into the world as Ferdinand de Bulhoes. After studying at the cathedral in Lisbon, our saint joined the Canons Regular of Saint Augustine, later went to the priory at Coimbra, and was ordained to the priesthood circa 1220. He transferred to the Franciscans in 1221, took the name of Anthony, and traveled to Morocco to preach to the Muslims there. Due to illness he had to return to Europe and attended a meeting of his order at Assisi, Italy in 1221. When he delivered a homily at an ordination, Anthony was so eloquent that he was asked to preach throughout Italy. Large crowds gathered wherever Anthony preached. Appointed the first Franciscan lector of theology, he was also envoy to Pope Gregory IX and eventually was released from other duties in order to focus on preaching. He influenced many conversions, and he was said to be a great confessor. In Padua where he settled after 1226 he preached against corruption and moral laxity; his strong words played an important role in reforming the city. Anthony worked to abolish debtors' prisons and help the poor. He was only thirty-six when he died on a journey from Camposanpiero to Padua. Canonized in 1232, Anthony was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946.

The patron saint of the poor and oppressed, he is often depicted holding the infant Jesus because of an incident when a visitor reported seeing Anthony doing this very thing. We may also think of the symbolic nature of this depiction: Anthony carries Christ; he takes Christ into the world, as should we all.

At least two films about his life are available, Anthony: Warrior of God and Saint Anthony: The Miracle Worker of Padua. We celebrate the feast of Saint Anthony of Padua on June 13.

MISS BEHAVIOR COUNTS TO 40

Dear Cuarenta:

How charming, but perhaps not coincidental, that your name means 40 in Spanish!

In the Bible, the number 40 appears on key occasions. For example, the Israelites wandered in the desert for 40 years. The Flood that Noah and his family endured lasted for 40 days and 40 nights. After being on Mount Sinai for 40 days, Moses presented the people with the Ten Commandments. Jesus fasted and prayed for 40 days before beginning his ministry. We observe a Lent of 40 days primarily because of Jesus' period of fasting, but certainly those other events resonate in our collective memory. Why 40? Dr. Marcellino D'Ambrosio (crossroadsinitiative.com) writes, "Probably because it is forty weeks that a woman carries her developing baby before a new life can come forth from the womb." That makes sense to me. Think of the new life that occurred after the Flood, after the Ten Commandments, and after Jesus' death.

The Franciscan Friars invite you to join them in welcoming Saint Anthony of Padua. St. Anthony will be visiting us in the form of two precious relics from his Basilica in Padua, Italy. The relics will be accompanied by a friar from the Messenger of St. Anthony in Padua.
