What exactly is a papal bull? Does the pope have a farm with animals roaming around at the Vatican?

Dear JP:

Another interesting question from one of my favorite readers! No, the pope does not have a farm. A papal bull is an official document issued by the pope. Its name is derived from the Latin word *bullā* (seal) The seal on the document was usually made of lead, though for very important documents there could be a gold seal. These days bulls may be issued without a seal, though it is still used for the most important of bulls.

Original bulls exist from as far back as the eleventh century, since parchment began to be used at that time. Before that, papyrus was used, and that sort of paper deteriorated over the years. Some lead seals from the sixth century still exist. Imagine!

A papal bull normally begins with the pope's name, then the title *episcopus, servus servorum Dei* (bishop, servant of the servants of God). These documents are identified by their initial phrases, written, of course, in Latin, the Church's official language. The most recent papal bulls (so far as I can determine) are *Incarnationis Mysterium*, issued by Pope John Paul II in 1998 and announcing the Great Jubilee for the year 2000, and *Misericordiae Vultus*, Pope Francis's declaration of the Jubilee of Mercy for 2015-2016.

SAINT OF THE WEEK SAINT LAWRENCE OF ROME

Tradition tells us that Lawrence was born in Spain and was a deacon for Pope Sixtus II. In the year 258 the Holy Father's execution was ordered by Emperor Valerian. Lawrence was despondent, but when the pope predicted that Lawrence would join him in three days' time, Lawrence happily sold some of the Church's goods and gave the proceeds to the poor. The Prefect of Rome, having heard of Lawrence's good deeds, ordered Lawrence to give the Church's wealth to the Emperor. Lawrence asserted that he needed three days to do this, but he thwarted the emperor by giving the profits to the poor and disadvantaged. The Prefect took his revenge on Lawrence by fastening him to a gridiron—what we now call a griddle—and broiling him. His legend tells us that he asked his executioner to turn him over since he was sufficiently broiled on one side. This example of humor in the face of death may in part have led to Lawrence's designation as the patron saint of cooks. The poet Prudentius believed that Lawrence's martyrdom led to a turning toward God on the part of third-century Romans. We celebrate the feast of St. Lawrence of Rome on August 10.


