


Prayer for the True Presence

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding Of Scripture

A Catholic friend of mine occasionally says, “The Eucharist is not a noun. It’s a verb.” In so saying, he is making the point that the Eucharist isn’t simply Jesus’ bodily presence given to us in holy Communion. It also manifests the dynamic pattern by which Christ actively loves and saves us. He teaches us to cooperate with that pattern. This Eucharist actually embodies four verbs: Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives. Let’s consider each one.

He **takes**: Do we acknowledge that we are totally in God’s hands? Do we receive everything in our lives as a gift, and act responsibly with it?

He **blesses**: Do we actively reflect that Jesus makes us holy in our baptism? Do we embrace our bodies and souls as temples of God, worthy of love, peace, and joy?

He **breaks**: Do we run from failure and disappointment, from getting old or being ignored? Are we too worried about getting hurt or sick? Do we embrace our sufferings with confidence?

He **gives**: Are we willing to make our lives a gift for others? Are we confident that we will always have enough love to give to others, that God will always provide enough for us? Do we rejoice in giving away what we have to others, expecting nothing in return? This is the dynamic life the Eucharist empowers us to live.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

We Can Prepare the Upper Room

We all know that person, don't we? Hey, maybe we've even been that person.

"I have a great relationship with God, but I don't go to church regularly. God and I are on good terms. I can talk to Him just fine on my own."

There isn't anything false in these statements. It's important to have an intimate, even conversational prayer relationship with God. But the problem with this attitude is that it implies that churches don't matter. Community worship doesn't matter. Today, we are reminded exactly why that is so untrue. Why we need our parishes, our priests, and each other.

The Body and Blood of Christ — that's what it's all about. If it's not about that, it's not about anything. If we don't have the Eucharist, we're just like the ancient priests, making sacrifices that don't have the power to redeem anybody.

Where do we receive the Body and Blood of Christ? For most of us, it's in our parishes. The altar of sacrifice is also the table we gather in front of, as a family, to become one with Christ in the truest and realest way possible, recreating the scene in the Upper Room over and over again every time Mass is celebrated.

The disciples were commissioned by Christ to prepare the Upper Room for the Last Supper. How can we take up that work ourselves? How can we strengthen the bonds in our spiritual family? How can we serve our parish, always remembering that the table is not meant to be set only for two?

Dear brothers and sisters,

We are celebrating this Sunday, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, acknowledging and honoring the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and his presence among us as the people of God, the Church. We receive Jesus in the sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ and we become the Body of Christ in the world as the Church through Baptism and strengthen and supported through His presence in the Eucharist. It is the celebration of the Eucharist each Sunday that is the source and summit of our Christian life that we live out in our parish communities.

The bishop has appointed me as the new pastor of the three parishes of Christ our Savior, Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, Christ the Good Shepherd in collaboration with each other as a part of the Diocesan regionalization. It is to allow for a more vibrant experience for parish life as we share our strengths across our three parishes while maintaining our separate identities. It will take awhile as we begin our journey of collaborating together, something to discuss and put into practice throughout the year. Since my new assignment as your pastor begins on July 1, 2025, there is one thing that cannot wait very long.

The schedule of our worship between the three parishes needs to be worked out sooner than later because I can only celebrate a set number of Masses and I am not able to celebrate two places at the same time. Current schedule involves two parishes, and we will now be three parishes. The chart below shows what it looks like without any adjustments or changes.




