



## GOSPEL MEDITATION

### Encourage Deeper Understanding Of Scripture

When I was a kid growing up in New England, I'd occasionally go on a whale watch. Once we went out with calm waters and clear skies. But on the way back in, the sea got rough. I was just a kid, and I remember thinking we should turn left or right toward the shoreline I could see. But the pilot of the boat kept going straight — right into the waves — focused on a small, discouragingly distant lighthouse. Even when it flickered in and out of sight, he stayed the course. He knew where he was going.

That image comes to mind when I hear Jesus' words in today's Gospel regarding false messiahs: **"Do not follow them" (Luke 21:8)**. In times of chaos or uncertainty, there are always voices offering easier routes, promising false safety, claiming to speak for God. But Jesus isn't found in the loudest voice or the nearest shoreline. He is steady, like a lighthouse in the storm.

The tribulation of which Jesus speaks — it's real. It happened to the Temple, it happened to him, it happens in the Church, and it will come to each of us. But the command is not to panic. It's to endure. To keep steering toward him. Faith isn't about having all the answers or dodging every wave. It's about knowing where the lighthouse is — and trusting it enough to keep going, especially when false safety beckons us to stop.

## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is barely mid-November and we have had our first taste of winter with a few cold days and the first snow fall. We are only a week and a half from celebrating Thanksgiving. We are currently in the last few weeks of the church calendar with a new liturgical year beginning on November 30<sup>th</sup> with the First Sunday of Advent. The "holiday season" has been creeping in before Halloween, but it is here in the television commercials and store displays. This early celebration often over shadows Thanksgiving and a day break with some turkey and football.

It would be good for us as a community of faith, to reflect on the prayers and scripture readings in these last few weeks of Ordinary Time. During this time, we focus on Christ's reign and prepare for His second coming. The final Sunday of this Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, is representative of His reign. As we begin the new liturgical year with the Season of Advent, we focus on not only the coming of Jesus into the world at his birth, but also his second coming when he will return in glory.

As we look to a new year both in the Church and in the Calendar on January 1<sup>st</sup>, it would be helpful for us to look at making a real attempt at collaboration between the parishes. There will be much to do as we work out a plan for our three parishes to work together and share more than a few things to help each parish respond to the call of Jesus' mission, and as we form ourselves into missionary disciples. My concern is that many people only hear, that we remain our individual parish and do not hear the collaborating or working together part.

The best way I can think to explain our formation by Bishop Bonnar as a Collaborative Unit of parishes is the 1958 film *The Defiant Ones* with Tony Curtis and Sidney Poitier. Curtis and Poitier are members of a chain gang being transported through the South when their truck crashes and they have a chance to escape. The issue is that the two men are shackled together, and need to work together even though they are very different. We can imagine that Paul Newman is the third fettered to Curtis and Poitier. I am not suggesting our three parishes our convicts on a chain gang, but the only way we can remain individual parishes is that we are shackled together by our collaborative grouping. A new year offers us opportunity and our Lord is here to guide us to it.

## Two Things Can Be True At Once

As my husband and I drove our firstborn child home from the hospital, I sat alongside my daughter in the backseat. Terrified, exhausted, exhilarated, confused, hopeful — I was all of these things at the same time. I gazed at her, this magnificent little creature whose face was both familiar and strange to me, thinking: *She is exquisite. She is the future. She is life.*

And then I burst into uncontrollable sobs.

“What’s wrong?” my husband cried, panicked, glancing in the rearview mirror.

“She’s — going — to — die — someday,” I blubbered, choking on my own tears.

“Ohhh, honey.” I’ll never forget the tone of his voice as he clearly debated turning this car around and taking me back to the hospital for an emergency psych evaluation. “I think you might be tired.”

Ten years later, it’s a memory we laugh about. I hadn’t slept more than four hours in four days. Postpartum hormones had lain waste to my senses. Here, on the threshold of new life, all I could think of was death. It’s funny. It’s absurd.

But it also makes a lot of sense.

Love and hate. Hope and fear. Joy and sorrow. Death and life. What lasts forever, and what is even now passing away before our eyes. To be human is to know that these feelings, these realities, can and often do occur at the same time. To be Christian is to know that it means something — even if we cannot understand what. Not yet.

In every moment of his earthly life, Christ shows us that two things can be true at once. A virgin is a mother. An exile is a king. The temple will be destroyed, and it will last forever. The world is ending. The world is beginning. The cross is death. The cross is life.
