

My Dear St Bridget Family,

Welcome to the second part of Ordinary Time in the liturgical cycle, which began last Monday (after the Solemnity of Pentecost). Ordinarily the color would have returned to green, however today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This solemnity brings us face to face with the foundation of our faith. The readings for this Sunday provide insight into the Trinitarian nature of our God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit.



The readings of this Sunday are probably some of the shortest readings in the liturgical cycle. Because the mystery of the Trinity is beyond our comprehension, these readings do not so much seek to expound on the Trinity, but rather to invite us to celebrate and marvel at the Trinity. In the second reading, from the Letter to the Corinthians, there is an explicit invitation for us to be part of the Trinitarian relationship.

The Trinitarian nature of our God is manifested in the second reading as it mentions the three persons of the Holy Trinity. In this reading, St Paul explains the unique privilege we have of being children of God through Jesus Christ.

In the first reading, we hear how Moses spoke to the people about the greatness of God. Then he admonished the people to commit themselves to the Lord God. Moses does this by pointing out to them the singular majesty of the God who has taken such a personal interest in their welfare. He goes ahead to invite them (if in doubt) to test the truthfulness of his claim. Ask anyone, he says to them, and they will tell you that there is no one like this God.

The Trinitarian God whom we celebrate today, is beyond comprehension. And yet, in the mystery of His glory, God reached down into the chaos of this world in order to redeem us and the world. In the gospel reading, we are presented with the account of the commissioning of the disciples by Jesus. This commissioning is very important because not only does it point out the Trinity, but it is also the commission that brings God to us and us to God.

In the commissioning, Jesus declared that all power in heaven and on earth had been given to Him and that it was in employing that power that He was commissioning them. Remember that Jesus is Emmanuel, God with us. The Disciples were therefore commissioned by God to go to all the nations to bring men and women who accept this good news into the Kingdom of God.

The great commission sent the disciples a mission as they are told to go and make disciples of all nations. All social or cultural boundaries are dissolved; ethnic and national restrictions no longer apply. All the promises made to the people of Israel are now open to all nations and peoples.

My dear brothers and sisters, what we celebrate today is a model for our unity. We have many lessons to learn from the Holy Trinity. The most important is that, like the Holy Trinity, we can live and work together as one family of God. This is because, we bear one and the same image of God, and were baptized by the same Spirit of God whose mark we bear (Eph 4, 30). So, in spite of our individual personalities and differences, unity is possible and a fundamental option.

Secondly, today's celebration has much to teach us about unity in our relationships, friendships, marriages, families and communities. It also reminds us that, in spite of our different talents, gifts, social and economic levels, we can live and work together for our salvation and our salvation of the world.

Finally, the celebration of the Holy Trinity reminds us that if we remain united, our different personalities would become our strength, rather than our weakness or the cause of our disintegration. For their love and unity, let us praise the Most Holy Trinity: *Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, Amen.*

## THE MYSTERY OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus speaks with his authority as God and sends us to teach and baptize in the name of the Trinity. - Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

## FEAST OF FAITH

### Liturgy and the Holy Trinity

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit's power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is "the sacrament of trinitarian communion" (*Sacramentum Caritatis*, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are "a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (quoted in *Sacramentum Caritatis*, 16).

# The Most Holy TRINITY

## SHALL WE DANCE?

The famous icon by the equally famous fourteenth-century iconographer Andrej Rublev is a depiction of the Trinity densely packed with symbolic content. The three "angels" sitting at a table are actually meant to be the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. They relate to each other in loving gesture, each one to the other, often described as "dance-like." And yet this triangular circle seems incomplete. Indeed it is, because we must become one with this circle of life-giving love. As in a dance, we are drawn into the divine life in the Trinitarian embrace of abundant glory and harmony. Then we complete the movement by taking that love incarnated out to the world, revealing the mystery to our sisters and brothers through our own lives.



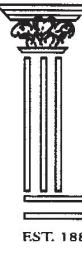
