Dear Parishioners and friends of St. Lawrence:

It is hard to know where to begin on the Diocesan meeting for all the priests and leaders of the parishes. All the information we received will be given in the Catholic Moment, October 6. General timeline was given for the implementation. Much more is being planned and hopefully will provide clarity where there is so much uncertainty, but that will clear up in the months ahead.

In general, the plan is to have all local parishes (that means "in the diocese") working cooperatively and focused on the three priorities of "discipleship," "community," and "witness." The process will not be without challenges but if we are all working together, all our parish communities will be learning from each other.

The focus on "discipleship" is at the core of the life of the church. As I began my theology training in New Orleans, it became clear to me that before I could become a priest, I first must be a "disciple" of Jesus. A disciple is a "student" or one who follows another – learning from the "Master" or "Lord" both from His words and way of life. To be a disciple means to follow Christ and live in union with Him. This is a life-long journey, never completed until He calls us home. This discipleship should be at the heart of everyone's life and faith. Whenever you hear the words "and Jesus said to His disciples," you should hear Him speaking to you – directly – for you are His disciples of today.

Another important dimension of this is that Jesus' resurrection is not a past event but an ongoing event. He rose but He is risen. He lives now in our midst. He is with us, He is among us, and He desires to make His home within us. "If you keep my commandments, my Father and I will come and dwell within you." The goal of every Christian life is expressed in the words of St. Paul – "it is no longer I who lives, but Christ who lives in me." To be and become one with Him is the goal of discipleship. To the extent of this reality, we become "missionary disciples." If Christ dwells within us, then where we are, He is. After the resurrection, Jesus appears to His disciples and says, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so now I send you."

The other two pillars of the Uniting in Heart are "community" and "witness." These will be the focus of my next two columns.

Began last Sunday, September 22, in St. Agnes Hall. This is for families who have children in grades K thru 8 –


both at St. Lawrence School and the public schools.
