Father Dave's Column

Dear Parishioners and friends of St. Lawrence:

(I requested permission from the Bishop to share his message given last weekend at St. Elizabeth Seton Church.)

July 4-5, 2020, by Bishop Timothy Doherty
God so loved the world.... (John 3:16)

This is why Christ came and instituted his church. Go and make disciples. This is who we are. It is important at this uncomfortable juncture to remember who WE are. We are at a moment when some people are defining others and their social stances. Let's not forget what defines us.

St. Elizabeth Seton parish has a wonderful history, and Father Ted Rothrock has been very much a part of this. Priests and people here say we are welcoming, and so we build moments to put that into practice. There are social outreaches to Haiti, to the needy, and advocacy for the education of children. The parish is a strong supporter of diocesan ministries. The Divine Liturgy here, the Mass, is treated with reverence and with worthy music. The Liturgy of the Hours is a daily public practice. There are ongoing opportunities for spiritual growth: "CRHP," RCIA, and Awaken, just to name a few that I am familiar with. This is who we are.

We also realize that area parishes and schools are not the only ministries carried out in the name of the Church. We are defined by Catholic-sponsored healthcare systems here in Central Indiana that are a huge presence here both as employers and care providers. By contrast, defining others is perilous. On June 16, the Catholic News Agency and the National Catholic Register –which are part of the EWTN organization– published an article titled "Can Catholics Support "Black Lives Matter"? It tells us at least two important things. First, that there are dozens of organizations that use that phrase. One of them, The Black Lives Matter Global Network Foundation, clearly says things that I oppose. Second, it is only one organization among many dozens using the phrase BLM, and it is a mistake to say that that foundation is the headquarters of what is a very diverse movement.

We can't capture the facts of what is happening across different movements inside and outside the United States by simply referring to an unspecific "THEY" or "IT." I am here today also so we remember who I am, the bishop over this parish community. As every priest learns at seminary, and

SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680) July 14

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs’ Shrine, traffic’s roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Osseron to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri’s parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of “Christian” traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri’s faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young “Lily of the Mohawks” drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does “the aroma of Christ” (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel?

as we hear in the words for the Ordination of Priests, the priest, the pastor, is an extension of the bishop's ministry. A priest's capacity to celebrate Mass and Sacraments is an expression of the bishop's own mission to govern, teach and sanctify. Each Mass reminds us of this connection when the bishop is prayed for by name.

Could we imagine that Fr Rothrock's bulletin article of June 28, much less his choice of wording, is an extension of, and expression of a Catholic bishop's apostolic role in the Church? Some people chose to think so. But we know it is not, and in my conversation here on Wednesday with Father Ted, he knows it too. The serious consequences of that article are still playing out among us, and in the wider community. I chose the suspension provided for in church law. The suspension offers me an opportunity for pastoral discernment for the good of the diocese, of St. Elizabeth Seton Church, and for the good of Father Rothrock.

I ask your continuing prayers for the parish, our church and for me. Pray for Father Rothrock who is still a friend to many of us. And if anyone asks you, you can tell them that this bishop says that Black lives matter.

Keep in mind these two citations:

10 I urge you, brothers, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and in the same purpose.¹¹ For it has been reported to me about you, my brothers, by Chloe's people, that there are rivalries among you.¹² I mean that each of you is saying, "I belong to Paul," or "I belong to Apollos," or "I belong to Cephas," or "I belong to Christ."¹³ Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? — I Corinthians 1:10-12, NAB*

In today's Gospel from Matthew, our Lord shares the Parable of the Sower who scatters seed on many different kinds of land. This is a wonderful analogy for the stewardship way of life, demonstrating the slow and steady, yet powerful effect this lifestyle will have on those who fully embrace it.



In this parable, some of the seeds land on a path where birds carry them off before they can begin to take root. Other seeds land on rocky ground with little soil. As soon as things begin to heat up, they get scorched and die. Then there are seeds that land on soil cluttered with thorns which choke the seeds just as they are beginning to grow strong.

Finally, there are seeds that land on deep and healthy soil. These seeds produce abundant fruit.

This is where the stewardship way of life comes in. When we give the best of our time, talent and treasure to serve God and others, we create lives filled with that rare "good soil" needed for the Kingdom of God to thrive.

How does this happen? Stewardship living removes the "rocks" of mistrust from our lives as we develop an unshakable faith that God will always provide for our needs. It clears away the "thorns" of worldly ambition that make us self-centered, fill us with needless anxiety and stifle our focus on God. Stewardship living requires a deep reliance on the Word of God and the sacraments which continuously nourish and fertilize the soil of our lives.

Let us deepen our commitment to this way of life, allowing the Sower to do His work in us, slowly and steadily. The Master Gardner will surely produce miraculous fruits through us.
