Pastor's Column: A Message from Father Underwood

What does it mean that our three Muncie parishes are now called a pastorate? A

pastorate is an organization of parishes which has a single pastor, one pastorate leadership team and one pastoral council. It is where the parishioners, within the boundaries of a given pastorate, form as one community in faith. It is where we seek God's grace in the Sacraments and as missionary disciples carry out the mission of the Church spreading the Good News of the Gospel - bringing people to an encounter with Christ our Savior.



In Muncie, our pastorate is composed of the parishes of St. Francis, St. Lawrence, and St. Mary – collaborating to build up the Catholic faith in Muncie. We are embracing the three pillars of Uniting in Heart – Mission, Community and Witness. These pillars will shape all that we do to live our faith and serve our Lord.

Mission: This pillar has always evoked the thought of pilgrimage. We are all together on the pilgrim journey towards Heaven, seeking Christ every step of the way. Our call is to become holy, and to help one another to do likewise. Essentially, we are on the journey of loving Christ in order to become saints.

Community: Each of us are being called by Christ to become disciples. Disciples follow their master, are formed by him, and become like him. There are so many ways we are formed as disciples in community – through our Catholic schools, faith formation programs, in our family homes, in our parish ministries, and most especially when we pray together. Together we encounter Christ – and together we become his followers.

Witness: Our faith is meant to come alive and be shared. It should not be kept private or hidden. As Catholics, we witness to our faith in both word and deed. At all times, we are to demonstrate our deep love for Christ so that others come to know him through us.

These pillars are not new. They are the foundation to Christ's public ministry and the mission of the Church. We are called to live out these pillars in our particular time, place, and state in life. Together, in our diocese, we can be so much more effective when we live as the Body of Christ – united for the glory of God.

By now, you know how excited your new priests are to be working with each other – and with you here in Muncie! This mission of the Muncie Pastorate is a real blessing to us, and we continue to thank God for bringing us here.

Continuing the Meditations on Transition...

First Word: Forsaken

And about three o'clock Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "*Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?*" -- which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:46

My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?
 Why so far from my call for help,
 from my cries of anguish?
 My God, I call by day, but you do not answer;
 by night, but I have no relief.

Do not stay far from me,
 for trouble is near,
 and there is no one to help. Excerpts from Psalm 22

When change comes upon us, which is more than likely how it happens, our initial response is often, "No! Not this!" When we are forced to relinquish something, we cherish our prayer might be (if we're honest) "God, where are you?" Or perhaps, "God, how could you!?" Jesus' own prayer from the tortuous suffering of the cross is no less honest and real. "My God, My God why have you forsaken me?" We can lose sight of the fact that Jesus in his humanity suffered genuine physical pain and spiritual desolation. His prayer of Psalm 22 on the cross reminds us of his very real anguish. If we can for a moment hear and see Jesus' pain, can we truly expect he won't understand ours?

Fr. William Barry, SJ in his book, "Praying the Truth," exhorts us to be utterly honest with God about how we feel in any given moment. In frustration, anger, heart break, keen disappointment, we are encouraged to be honest in our prayer—in our conversation with God, with Jesus. And then be no less open to the honesty we may hear from God.

Practice: For the next three days, see how honest can you be with God about the change and endings you are experiencing. And as you would with a friend you deeply trust, listen to his response to you.

CATHOLIC MINISTRIES APPEAL


