This Week's Readings – Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year A – July 12, 2020

<u>First Reading</u> (Isaiah 55:10-11) Just as rain and snow come down from heaven and do not return until the whole earth is watered and fruitful, so shall the word of the Lord go out to do God's will and accomplish God's purpose.

<u>Second Reading</u> (Romans 8:18-23) Paul told the Romans that the whole created world eagerly awaits the revelation of God's children. The world will be set free and take part in the wonderous freedom of God's children.

<u>Gospel</u> (Matthew 13:1-23) Jesus told the parable of the sower. When disciples questioned him about it, he explained how those who hear the word and understand it will bear fruit and yield a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold.

Next Week's Readings – Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year A – July 19, 2020

<u>First Reading</u> (Wisdom 12:13,16-19) Though powerful, the Lord judges with mercy and governs with care. God teaches people kindness, hope, and repentance.

<u>Second Reading</u> (Romans 8:26-27) Paul reminded the Romans that the Spirit helps God's people in their weakness and intercedes for them.

<u>Gospel</u> (Matthew 13:24-43) Jesus told the crowd the parable of the wheat and the weeds, the parable of the mustard seed, and the parable of the yeast. Through parables, he encouraged his disciples, assuring them that God's saints would shine like the sun in the heavenly reign.
