August 2/3 – 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Year C

1st Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23 (114C) – “All things are vanity!” Some people have labored skillfully a whole lifetime, but the fruits of their labor go to others who did nothing. What good comes from hard work? Everything is vanity.

2nd Reading: Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 – Since you now belong to Christ, set your heart on things above rather than on things on earth. For in Christ there is not Greek or Jew, slave or free person. “Christ is all and in all.”

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21 – Jesus told a parable about the rich men who stored up all his wealth in order to eat, drink and be merry. God told him, “You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you.” In this way Jesus encouraged people to grow rich, not for themselves, but in God’s sight.
