**1**st **Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21 (123C)** – The prophet spoke of the Lord's coming to gather all nations together. They would proclaim God's glory, bringing offering to Jerusalem in clean vessels. The lord chose some as priests. **2**nd **Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13** – The author of Hebrews offered encouragement: "Do not disdain the disciple of the Lord....Make straight...that what is lame may not be disjointed but healed."
