

Lector

A Lector has the ability to stand in front of people and be comfortable reading the Scriptures and the Prayers of the Faithful.

Lectors are scheduled for a weekend Mass, and the readings are sent out early in the week so each lector has time to review the readings.

Depending on the Mass times and how many lectors are on the schedule, lectors typically are scheduled every month/month and a half. Schedules are printed in advance so there is ample time to find substitutes if needed. The office is also happy to help find a substitute if a lector cannot make a scheduled Mass.

Eucharistic Minister

A Eucharistic Minister is a parishioner who distributes the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ during the Holy Communion.

Eucharistic Ministers Schedules will begin being sent out in October. We are in need of Eucharistic Ministers for all weekend Masses. There will be a short training session for this ministry.

Altar Server

Altar Servers carry the cross during the opening procession and hold the book for the priest celebrant when he is not at the altar. Servers also present the bread, wine, and water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts and wash the hands of the priest.

Altar Servers must have already made their First Holy Communion.

There will be a detailed training session for this ministy.


