JASON DIEBOLT at St. John Vianney Seminary, graduated from Guerin Catholic High School and immediately entered into seminary. Now as a junior, Diebolt said the biggest grace throughout his time in school is allowing God to be present in his life through every challenge and success.



"It's been a wonderful journey," he said. "Your life changes a lot when you take this step. I think that's the biggest challenge and to ask God each day, 'Lord I need your help, in everything that I do.' It's allowed me to stay grounded in prayer and in my own life.

"It's impossible to live without my faith," Diebolt added. "Praying consistently daily has allowed me to really grow in love—of others, of God and of neighbor. It's allowed me to not be afraid to spread the Gospel to others through love, and to not be afraid to put a smile on your face and talk about God. The biggest thing for me is being happy with where I'm at and know that God has put me here for a reason."

As we continue this Easter Season celebrating the Sacraments, this is a good time to remind everyone about the requirements for Baptism. First and foremost, parents and Godparents must be fully initiated, registered, active and practicing Catholics. If the Godparent(s) come from parish outside our Cluster, a letter from their Pastor stating they are married according to the Catholic Church and are active practicing Catholics is required. This letter is required three (3) weeks prior to Baptism. Expectant parents are to make arrangements for a Baptismal Class during the 3rd-4th-5th or 6th month of pregnancy. Questions?
