A Message From Our Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Palm Sunday begins Holy Week, a powerful time of grace when the whole Church throughout the world together remembers the salvation won for us. Take to heart the depth of God's love for you, what He is willing to endure that you may trust Him and love Him. Keep this week different from other weeks and especially the days of the Holy Triduum (Holy Three Days), which begins with the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Thursday evening and reaches the high point in the Easter Vigil.

On Holy Thursday we recall Jesus' institution of the Holy Eucharist and the sacred priesthood. The Church teaches that Jesus is truly present in the most Holy Eucharist. At the Last Supper we hear, "Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples said, 'Take and eat; this is my body'" (Mt 26:26b). Under the appearance of bread and wine, the whole Christ is truly present body, blood, soul and divinity (ref. Catechism of the Catholic Church, par. 1374). "In the Eucharist Jesus does not give us a 'thing,' but himself; he offers his own body and pours out his own blood. He thus gives us the totality of his life and reveals the ultimate origin of this love. He is the eternal Son, given to us by the Father" (Sacramentum Caritatis, par. 7). Jesus is the bread of life given to us by the eternal Father.



On Good Friday, we adore the cross saying, "Behold the wood of the cross, on which hung the salvation of the world. Come, let us adore" (Roman Missal). Good Friday is the one day of the year when Mass is not offered, a day of mourning and mystery. The veneration of the cross is emotionally moving as we honor the symbol of our salvation. Many sentiments arise such as sadness and gratitude. We recall the love of God as He willingly descended and spent time with those who betray Him. Not only that, but He suffers a cruel pain for us who have sinned multiple times, repeatedly. O what wondrous love is this! Please remember that Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence from meat. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

Finally, in progressing and moving towards the celebration of the mother of all vigils, we celebrate the Easter Vigil. We hear in the Exsultet, "O truly blessed night, when the things of heaven are wed to those of earth, and divine to the human." On this greatest of nights, we celebrate the resurrection of the Church's spouse and her savior. We celebrate and welcome those individuals who come into the Church this year and renew our own baptismal promises. Jesus who was once dead now lives. The light of God triumphs over the darkness of our world and our own hearts. Christ continues to work in our lives, shepherding us and leading us to eternal life where He has gone before us. We continue with our lives, remembering and never forgetting that Christ is Risen! He is Risen, indeed!

Thus, during this Holy Week, there are a number of adjustments to the usual weekly schedule. A reminder that Easter Sunday, the Mass times are as follows:

- Saturday, April 19, St. Peter, Winamac at 8:30pm (Easter Vigil)
- Saturday, April 19, St. Joseph, Rochester at 8:30pm (Easter Vigil)
- Sunday, April 20, St. Joseph, Pulaski at 8:00am
- Sunday, April 20, St. Joseph, Rochester at 9:30am
- Sunday, April 20, St. Peter, Winamac at 10:00am
- Sunday, April 20, St. Joseph, Rochester at 11:30am (in Spanish)

Lastly, when the Easter Season begins, I am excited that for the Jubilee Year and with St. Joseph, Pulaski being a Pilgrimage Site, we will be having adoration of the exposed Blessed Sacrament for public adoration on Thursdays after the 8:00am at St. Joseph, Pulaski until 6:00pm. This will be each Thursday from April 24 through Oct. 23. Your help is needed so that we do not leave Jesus un-adored during that time. Will you watch one hour with Jesus? There is a sign-up board in the back of the church in Pulaski to sign up for an hour of prayer with Jesus. You can also sign-up online by going to our website and using the Sign Up Genius website. We need YOU to adore!

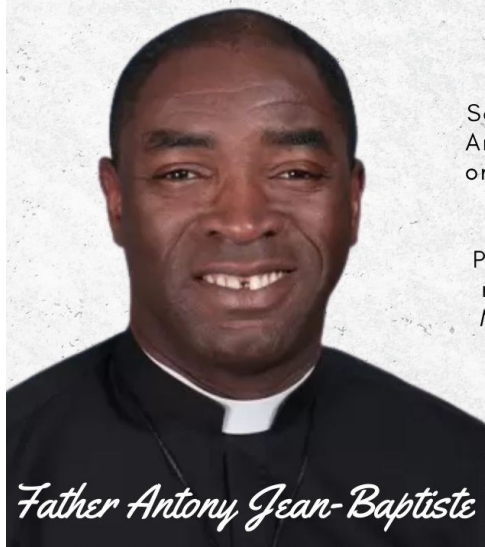

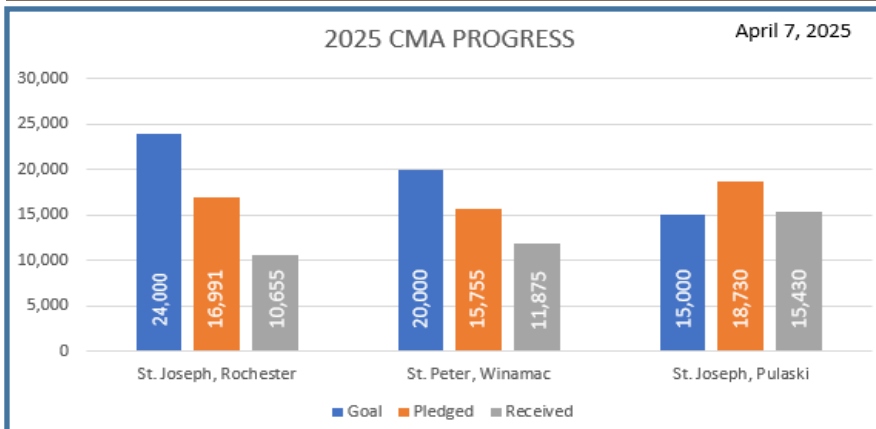

Un mensaje de nuestro pastor



Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo,

Con el Domingo de Ramos comienza la Semana Santa, tiempo fuerte de gracia, en el que toda la Iglesia, en todo el mundo, recuerda unida la salvación ganada para nosotros. Iglesia en todo el mundo recuerda la salvación ganada para nosotros. Llevad en el corazón la profundidad del amor de Dios por vosotros, lo que está dispuesto a soportar para que confiéis en Él y le améis. Que esta semana sea distinta de las demás y, especialmente, de los días del Triduo Santo, que comienza con la Misa de la Cena del Señor, el jueves por la tarde, y alcanza su punto culminante en la Vigilia Pascual.

El Jueves Santo recordamos la institución por Jesús de la Sagrada Eucaristía y del sagrado sacerdocio. La Iglesia enseña que Jesús está verdaderamente presente en la Santísima Eucaristía. En la Última Cena oímos: «Jesús tomó pan, pronunció la bendición, lo partió y, dándoselo a sus discípulos, dijo: “Tomad y comed; esto es mi cuerpo”» (Mt 26, 26b). Bajo la apariencia del pan y del vino, todo Cristo está verdaderamente presente cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad (ref. Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, par. 1374). «En la Eucaristía, Jesús no nos da una 'cosa', sino a sí mismo; ofrece su propio cuerpo y derrama su propia sangre. Nos da así la totalidad de su vida y nos revela el origen último de este amor. Él es el Hijo eterno, que nos ha sido dado por el Padre» (Sacramentum Caritatis, par. 7). Jesús es el pan de vida que nos ha dado el Padre eterno.

El Viernes Santo adoramos la cruz diciendo: «He aquí el madero de la cruz, en el que pendía la salvación del mundo. Venid, adoremos» (Misal Romano). El Viernes Santo es el único día del año en que no se oficia misa, un día de luto y misterio. La veneración de la cruz es emotiva, ya que honramos el símbolo de nuestra salvación. Surgen muchos sentimientos, como la tristeza y la gratitud. Recordamos el amor de Dios al descender voluntariamente y pasar tiempo con aquellos que le traicionan. No sólo eso, sino que sufre un dolor cruel por nosotros que hemos pecado múltiples veces, repetidamente. ¡Qué amor tan maravilloso! Recuerde que el Viernes Santo es un día de ayuno y abstinencia de carne. Si es posible, el ayuno del Viernes Santo se continúa hasta la Vigilia Pascual como «ayuno pascual» para honrar el sufrimiento y la muerte del Señor Jesús y para prepararnos a compartir más plenamente y celebrar más fácilmente su Resurrección.

Finalmente, progresando y avanzando hacia la celebración de la madre de todas las vigiliass, celebramos la Vigilia Pascual. Escuchamos en el Exsultet: «Oh noche verdaderamente bendita, en la que las cosas del cielo se unen a las de la tierra, y lo divino a lo humano». En esta gran noche, celebramos la resurrección del Esposo de la Iglesia y de su Salvador. Celebramos y acogemos a las personas que entran en la Iglesia este año y renovamos nuestras propias promesas bautismales. Jesús, que una vez estuvo muerto, ahora vive. La luz de Dios triunfa sobre las tinieblas de nuestro mundo y de nuestros propios corazones. Cristo sigue actuando en nuestras vidas, pastoreándonos y conduciéndonos a la vida eterna donde Él nos ha precedido. Continuamos con nuestras vidas, recordando y nunca olvidando que ¡Cristo ha Resucitado! Sí, ha resucitado.

Así, durante esta Semana Santa, hay una serie de ajustes en el horario semanal habitual. Recordamos que el Domingo de Pascua, los horarios de las Misas son los siguientes:

- Sábado, 19 de abril, San Pedro, Winamac a las 8:30pm (Vigilia Pascual)
- Sábado, 19 de abril, San José, Rochester a las 8:30pm (Vigilia Pascual)
- Domingo, 20 de abril, San José, Pulaski a las 8:00am
- Domingo, 20 de abril, San José, Rochester a las 9:30am
- Domingo, 20 de abril, St. Peter, Winamac a las 10:00am
- Domingo, 20 de abril, San José, Rochester a las 11:30am (en español)

Por ultimo, cuando comience la temporada de Pascua, estoy emocionado de que para el Año Jubilar y con San José, Pulaski siendo un Sitio de Peregrinación, estaremos teniendo adoración del Santísimo Sacramento expuesto para adoración pública los jueves después de las 8:00am en San José, Pulaski hasta las 6:00pm. Esto será cada jueves desde el 24 de abril hasta el 23 de octubre. Su ayuda es necesaria para que no dejemos a Jesús sin adorar durante ese tiempo. ¿Vigilarás una hora con Jesús? Hay un tablero en la parte de atrás de la iglesia en Pulaski para inscribirse para una hora de oración con Jesús. También puedes inscribirte en línea yendo a nuestro sitio web y usando el sitio web Sign Up Genius. ¡Te necesitamos para adorar!
