SAINT RITA OF CASCIA FEAST DAY - MAY 22ND

Rita was born around 1381 at Cascia, Italy. Giving in to her parents' request she married. Her husband, an abusive man. was eventually murdered, victim of a family feud. When her two sons expressed the desire to avenge his death, Rita prayed to God to kill them to



keep them from staining their hands with blood. She then lived in a convent of Augustinian nuns in penitence and caring for the suffering. As a sign of her particular devotion to the Passion, a wound appeared on her forehead that was similar to that caused by a crown of thorns. She died in 1457 and was canonized in 1900. She is depicted in the Augustinian habit; there is the wound in her forehead and she adores the crucifix amid roses. The "patron saint of impossible causes and situations," she is invoked against smallpox and natural calamities and by women desiring to have children. Protector of Grocers and salami vendors.
