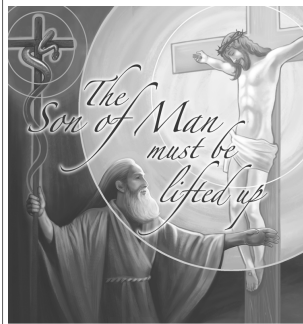

GOD'S MERCY

Today's reading from the second book of Chronicles contains a sort of "mini-history" of Israel. It highlights God's mercies in choosing Cyrus the Persian to be an instrument of deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment

they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation.

The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's mercy, revealed in the death of Jesus. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Matters Arising

**THE PREFACE, EPICLESIS, INSTITUTION and ANAMNESIS!!! ALL WITH
HEARTS LIFTED UP.**

Our active participation in the liturgy is very essential because of the nature of the liturgical worship. This call to be both bodily and spiritually present has even particular significance during the moment of **CONSECRATION** because The Eucharistic Prayer is the **HEART** of the Liturgy of the Eucharistic. And We enter into this most sacred moment with a liturgical dialogue between the priest/celebrant and the entire congregation.

P. The Lord be with you C. And with your Spirit

P. Lift up your hearts C. We lift them up to the Lord

P. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God ... C. it is right and just.

These three-line dialogue are expressive of the solemn moment we are entering during Mass, but the 2nd line tells us where our minds and hearts need to be as we make the Holy Oblation to God the Father almighty.

Yes, distraction is part of our human experience. Uncountable number of things out there tend to distract us in life. Some of us make concerted effort to avoid distraction especially when we are at Mass. But the truth is that most times we cannot help it. Very often our minds wander off; Repeatedly we try to concentrate and be focused. Repeatedly we find ourselves bodily present but absent minded. And then comes this *Most Sacred Moment* when the priest invites us **TO LIFT UP OUR HEARTS** and we promise to **LIFT THEM UP TO THE LORD**. Surely the moment calls for a keen attentiveness. The moment calls for maximum concentration. The moment calls for Active Participation. Our hearts and minds need not to be anywhere else other than in what is taking place on the altar – *the ascending and the descending of the powers of heaven*.

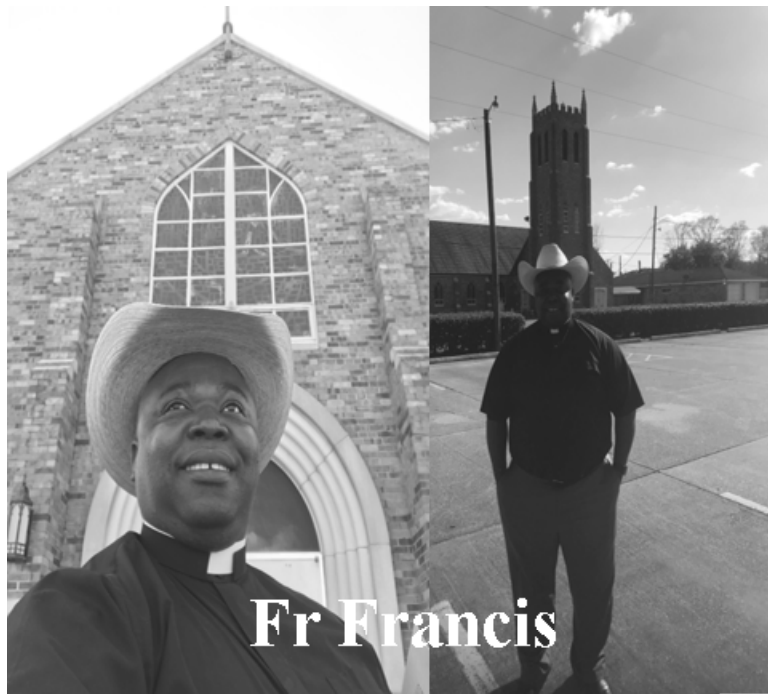
Active Participation requires us to *lift our hearts up to the Lord* as we pray the Preface, which is an act of thanksgiving that seeks to move the faithful to praise and joyfulness. No wonder St Cyril notes saying: "If at the beginning of the liturgy we are weighed down with our earthly cares, the **Preface** now asks us to set them aside. Lifting up our hearts means transcending the present difficulties and joining the heavenly liturgy, where all our troubles will vanish in the twinkling of an eye." And so, the Preface builds up to joining with all the heavenly hosts (whom we have joined because we've lifted our hearts up to heaven) and singing with them: Holy Holy Holy Lord God of Host....

Active Participation requires us to *lift our hearts up to the Lord* during the Epiclesis, that is, during the invocation" or "calling down from on high, by which the priest invokes the Holy Spirit upon the bread and wine which will become the True Body and Blood of Christ.

Active Participation requires us to *lift our hearts up to the Lord* during the Institution narrative – (Take and eat, this is my Body. Take and drink this is my Blood). For two thousand years these same Words of Jesus have made His Body and Blood to be present on our altar by the power of what the Church calls **TRANSUBSTANTIATION**. It is a very miraculous moment that one cannot afford to miss due to distraction.

Active Participation requires us to *lift our hearts up to the Lord* during the Anamnesis, a moment we remember Christ's self-sacrifice and death upon the Cross. A moment in which we remember that while Christ is not being re-crucified in any way, in God's timelessness we are being transported back in time to the Calvary. According to Mark Hart, "It is a time we get to participate as a Church in what Jesus did on the Cross; our tiny sacrifices are being taking up and joined with His perfect sacrifice. Our prayers, pains. Struggles, doubts, joys, blessings, hopes and dreams are all being elevated and perfected as we offer them to our Father in Heaven."

Distraction will come. Do not let it have the upper hand. **JUST LIFT UP YOUR HEART TO THE LORD.**

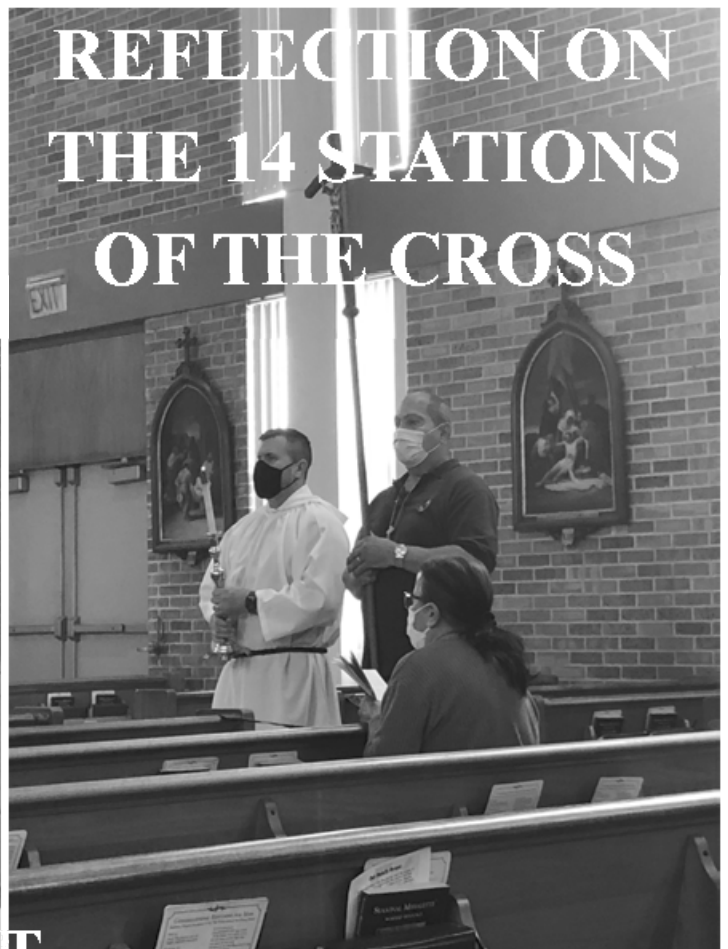

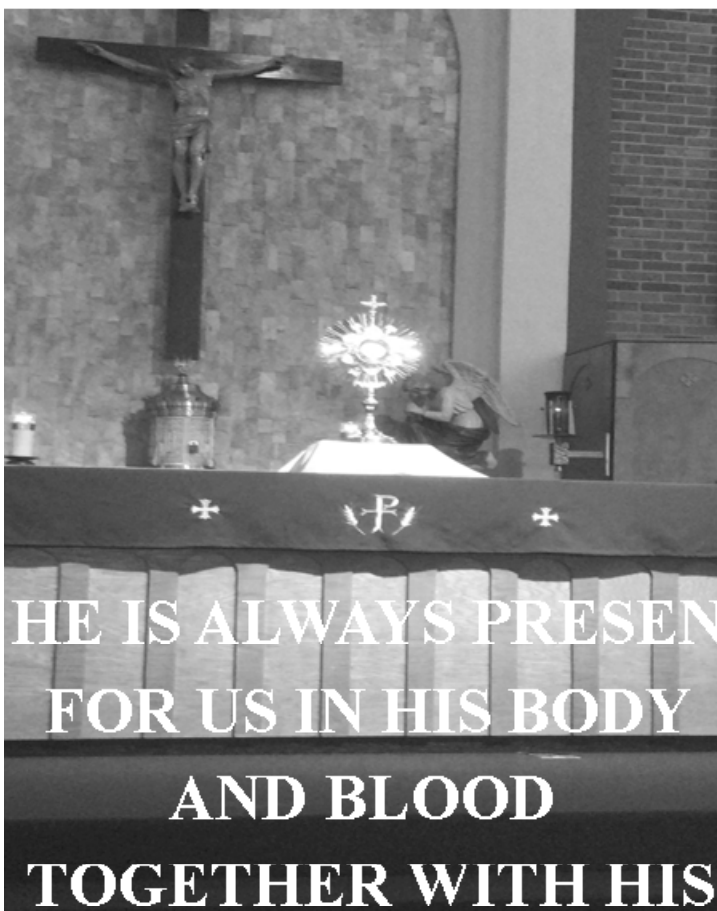

FEAST OF FAITH

Lent, a Season of the Word

Each year on the First Sunday of Lent we hear one of the Gospel accounts of the temptation of Jesus. In Luke's account, the devil cites the scriptures repeatedly, urging Jesus to interpret them in a false, self-serving way—if God sends angels to protect those whom God loves (as it says in Psalm 91), then prove it! But Jesus resists this insidious temptation by turning to scripture passages that tell of right relationship with God—living by God's word, trusting in God, and worshiping God alone. Jesus himself listened to the inspired word of God and let it shape and form him. Through the liturgy, we do the same. The readings we hear at Mass can teach us, but that is not their primary function. Rather, the scriptures are meant to reveal the Lord to us, to let us experience his presence, and to form us in our Christian identity. Christ's presence is realized by his spoken word, "since it is he himself who speaks when the Holy Scriptures are read in the Church" (*Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, 7). In the readings proclaimed at Mass, we hear the voice of Christ himself.

Seminarian Education Fund

On **March 20 and 21**, the Archdiocese of New Orleans will host a very important second collection to raise funds to offset the costs of educating seminarians at Notre Dame Seminary and St. Joseph Seminary College.
