

SPECIAL EVENTS COVERAGE: If you plan to use the church facilities for birthday parties, baby or bridal showers, or any event that is **not sponsored** by the parish, you will have to let Father Roger know three weeks prior to the event.

THE CHRISTIAN ORIGINS OF HALLOWEEN: "Halloween" is a name that means nothing by itself. It is a contraction of "All Hallows Eve," and it designates the vigil of All Hallows Day, more commonly known today as All Saints Day. ("Hallow," as a noun, is an old English word for saint. As a verb, it means to make something holy or to honor it as holy.) All Saints Day, November 1, is a Holy Day of Obligation, and both the feast and the vigil have been celebrated since the early eighth century, when they were instituted by Pope Gregory III in Rome. STEWARDSHIP SUMMARY: Both the first reading and today's Psalm say clearly that the Lord hears the cry of the poor. Have I been given the gifts – of time or money or abilities – to be the means by which God answers their need?


