Father Logsdon Logging In ...

He is Risen, Alleluia. He is Risen indeed, Alleluia! Jesus died and rose from the dead to give us the Hope of the fulfillment of God's promise. While the promise land from the Old Testament has often been associated with an earthly kingdom, we are promised something greater, eternal life in the heavenly kingdom. Now that we have completed the Lenten season, it is time to rejoice in the salvation that has been won for us. The battle is truly over and the victory is assured for those who remain faithful to the New Covenant in The Blood of Christ.

Two questions I often get asked are: How does the Church calculate the date of Easter? and Why is it called Easter in English while other languages call this feast Pascua? The date of Easter is based on the Jewish Passover, loosely. The Latin rite of the Church places the feast on the first Sunday, after the first full moon, after the Spring Equinox. That is why it varies from year to year. The second question is more difficult. If you look it up, AI will tell you it is a Saxon word in reference to a goddess of spring festivals. That is incorrect. The term 'Eostre' was assigned to the spring goddess, but the term had previously just referred to the new life coming froth from the dead earth every spring. That makes the term very appropriate for the new life coming out of the death of Christ.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Divine Mercy Sunday will be at Immaculate Conception on Sunday, April 27th.

Jesus said to St. Faustina "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on that day shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and purgatory. On that day all floodgates through which graces flow are opened" St. Faustina's Diary entry 699.—
This is the extraordinary grace of Divine Mercy Sunday: In God's eyes, we are given a clean slate!

Immaculate Conception Divine Mercy Sunday Devotions—to receive all graces possible on this day.

- Receive Communion (or on vigil), make a good Confession, venerate the Divine Mercy image, pray for the intentions of the pope (1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, 1 Glory Be), pray for the Divine Mercy Chaplet.

2:00 Adoration, Veneration & Confessions (until 3:30) Benediction 3:30. Father has graciously agreed to stay to complete all Confessions but if time is limited, you may go to Confession on another day at your earliest convenience.

***Also, Divine Mercy is ongoing: Jesus words to St. Faustina: "I am giving you 3 ways of exercising mercy towards your neighbor—the 1st by deed, the 2nd by word, the 3rd by prayer. In these 3 degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me" St. Faustina's Diary entry 742. ***



Sharing the Gospel


