HAS JESUS CHRIST OTHER BROTHERS?

The issue of Mary having other children has been confusing and controversial both for Catholics and other members of our separated brethren. In one of our Clergy dinners, this issue came up that some members of Jehovah's Witness engaged with some of our Catholic members telling them that Mary had other children. Here is my little contribution to this issue.

Catholics love Mary because of the beautiful role she played in the work of human salvation. It was she whom God chose to be the mother of Jesus Christ, the God-Man. Since Jesus is both God and Man, Mary is therefore called the mother of God (The *Theotokos*. The Dogma of the Blessed Virgin Mary as the mother of God propounded in 431 A.D. at the Council of Ephesus). Therefore, the honor we give to Mary is the honor which the Bible says she should be given - "For behold, henceforth all generations will call me blessed (Luke 1:48). Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to Mary "Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb" (Luke 1:42). However, the Church does not say that Mary is the Mediator between God and humanity. No. That is the role of Jesus Christ, the Savior. Mary is one of those God has saved. She, being the mother of our Savior and God, Jesus Christ, is our mother, hence, we turn to her to pray for us (John 2:3, Acts 1:14).

Many people have been asking and saying that Mary had other children apart from Jesus Christ. Hence, Jesus had siblings according to them. Mary had NO other child except Jesus Christ the Savior, conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 1:18). This misconception about Jesus having other brothers is a result of the Evangelists (Matthew 12:46; Mark 3:31-35; Luke 8:19-21) referred to some people as the brothers of Jesus. The Church teaches that Mary has no other children and she is ever virgin after giving birth to Jesus. This is the reason for "The Dogma of Ever Virginity of Blessed Virgin Mary" propounded in 649 A.D. at the Lateran Council in Rome. Those referred to as brothers of Jesus are named as James and Joseph (elsewhere Joset, Mark 6:3), Simon and Jude (Matthew 13:55, Mark 6:3), yet a different Mary is mentioned as the mother of James and Joset (Matthew 27:48, Mark 15:40). Similarly, the Apostle Paul called James the Lord's brother (Galatian 21:19), but we know too from the Bible that James and John were sons of Zebedee (Mark 1:19).

For the Jews, the term "brother" is used for a co-religionist or a near relation. For example, Paul addresses the Corinthians as: "And so, brothers, I was not able to talk to you as spiritual people." Obviously, the whole Christian community in Corinth was not of the same father and mother with Paul. Abram called Lot his brother (Genesis 13:8) but we know from the Scripture that they were really not brothers (Genesis 11:27). In Nigeria, where I come from, we also know that people with a claim to one ancestor call themselves brothers and sisters. Read the following passages from the Holy Scripture where the word "brother" is used - Matthew 5:22, 7:3-4, 18:15, 28:10; Acts 2:29, 3:17, 7:1-2, 9:17. In most of these places, you will see the word "brethren" used.

As we have begun our Lenten Fast, Prayer, and Almsgiving, we can dedicate praying the Rosary, asking Mother Mary to intercede for us and for PEACE in the world. Mary has been our most powerful Intercessor and the Mother of the Church (John 19:24-27). She has no other child except Jesus. May our Mother Mary pray for us in this Lenten Season. ~Fr. "Fasting and Abstinence Regulations" for the Archdiocese of Portland

- All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Fridays of Lent, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are asked to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. To fast means to eat one full meal; the other two meals that days should be less than the normal amount unless they are already at a minimum for good health. Eating between meals is not permitted; however, liquids including coffee, milk, and fruit juices are allowed.
