Enjoy this write up from one of our teens who participated in Mission Krewe 2025 as he reflects upon how his Mission experience captures the theme: "Hope does not disappoint" (Romans 5:5) during this Jubilee Year of Hope. ~ Fr. Michael

One thing I've learned during this Mission Krewe is that things don't always go the way you expect it. You may come in with plans and high hopes and, suddenly, something interrupts them. Something goes wrong. Something doesn't feel fair. But that doesn't mean the day is lost. I once heard an analogy. If you had \$24,000 and someone stole \$1,000 or even \$3,000, would you throw the rest of the money away? Of course not. You'd still hold onto the \$21,000 you have left. Because that \$21,000 still holds value and, no matter what, you will work harder to compensate for the loss of the money that was taken away.

Now think about your day. You have 24 hours. If someone frustrates you, wastes your time, or things don't go your way for a few hours, why throw away the rest of the day? The truth is, setbacks don't ruin a mission. They refine it. Because Mission Krewe isn't just about perfect plans, it's about enduring the hard times together. When we think of Mission Krewe, we often think of helping others. Feeding the hungry. Doing yardwork. Praying for strangers. Small things that might seem ordinary, but when done with love, they become extraordinary.

As Mother Teresa once said: "Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love." And when we do those small things with the love of Christ, they become holy. They reflect the very words of Jesus in Matthew 25:35-40:

For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in...Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.

This is the heart of Mission Krewe. Not just fixing problems but seeing people through the problems. Not just doing chores but restoring dignity and beauty. Not just checking off boxes, but becoming the hands and feet of Christ. Because Pope Francis once said, "You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them. That's how prayer works." Prayer is powerful. But love in action, that's what brings prayer to life.

And when we serve side by side, something unexpected happens, we grow, we evolve, we change. We start to see each other differently. Because when you go through hard times together, the times when you're tired, sweaty, uncomfortable, and still showing up, you begin to bond in a real way. Not the surface kind of friendship, but the deep kind. Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 says: "Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor. If either of them falls down, one can help the other up."

That's what Mission Krewe does. It gives us sacred space to "help each other up." To listen. To forgive. To laugh until we cry. To carry each other's burdens. And in those moments, in the mess, the beauty, and the exhaustion, we become more than a team. We become a family. St. Teresa of Avila once said: "Christ has no body now but yours, no hands, no feet on earth but yours. Yours are the eyes with which He looks compassion on this world." When we serve together, we become His body. We become the answer to someone's prayer. And maybe even the answer to our own.

In John 17:21, Jesus prayed for us: "That they may all be one, as You, Father, are in Me and I am in You." This unity isn't just about shared work, it's about shared love. Pope Francis reminds us: "To change the world, we must be good to those who cannot repay us." That's exactly what we've done here. We've shown up. We've loved without

expecting anything back. We've served not to feel good but to do good. Most of us stepped outside of our comfort zone and God met us there with open arms. And as we served others something sacred happened. We were changed too.

Mission Krewe isn't just about what we do, it's about who we become. The friendships formed in service are often deeper than those formed in ease. When we show up for each other, God shows up in us. So maybe the real Mission isn't just why we're here, but how God is shaping us through it: To be more generous, more humble, more united, and more like Him. And let's not forget what real friends are. The kind we form here isn't always easy. Proverbs 27:17 says "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." That kind of sharpening can spark but also hurt. But it makes both people stronger.

St. Aelred of Rievaulx, the patron saint of spiritual friendship, wrote: "Friendship is the guardian of love, the bond of peace, the medicine of life, the seal of harmony." Friendship rooted in Christ is not always perfect but it will always be persistent. It stays, it forgives, and it grows. And in John 15:13, Jesus tells us: "Greater love has no one than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." That doesn't always mean dying but sometimes it just means sacrificing your comfort, your pride, or your time.

So, if friendship gets hard, don't give up. Talk. Pray. Listen. Love. Because the friends who walk through the rough patches with you are the ones God is using to making you more like Christ. And maybe that's the greatest Mission of all because it gives HOPE to others.
