Service projects are a way for you to use your gifts, talents and abilities to help others. To be a true service project neither you nor anyone in your immediate family can benefit, either directly or indirectly, from your service. The goal is to look beyond yourself and beyond those nearest to you and give of yourself to help someone else.

### **Suggestions for Service Projects**

These suggestions are some of the ways a candidate may choose to serve. Perhaps something on this list will give you other ideas on how to use your special gifts.

***Note: Service hours should NOT involve work done within your immediate family (babysitting siblings, cutting the grass for Dad, washing the car for Mom....you need to carry out service work in the community (your neighborhood, your Church, your school, food pantries, hospitals, nursing homes, etc.) There are many options you and your fellow candidates can do together as a group! Make it fun!***

Visit the elderly of the parish at home or in a nursing home  
Assist the elderly/handicap in your neighborhood with chores such as cutting grass, yard work, etc.  
Organize or help with a recycling project  
Initiate a clean-up campaign in the parish school, local park, playground  
Do volunteer work in a hospital or in a hospice  
Write cards or letters to hospitalized children, teens or Military personnel  
Collect food for the poor or work in a food bank  
Earn money for missions by washing cars, babysitting etc.

Perform special services for the handicapped (reading to the blind, assist at the grocery)  
Collect toys for children who are less fortunate  
Make gifts or favors for hospital patients  
Tutoring after school  
Coach/assist with children's sports events
